Improving

One of the most significant changes to the high school campus is the addition of Pixellot cameras. The school district had been looking at purchasing these cameras in February of 2020, but the cost was prohibitive. However, with the pandemic came an opportunity: the IHSA and the National Federation of High Schools formed a partnership to allow schools to purchase Pixellot cameras at a much reduced cost. Using the

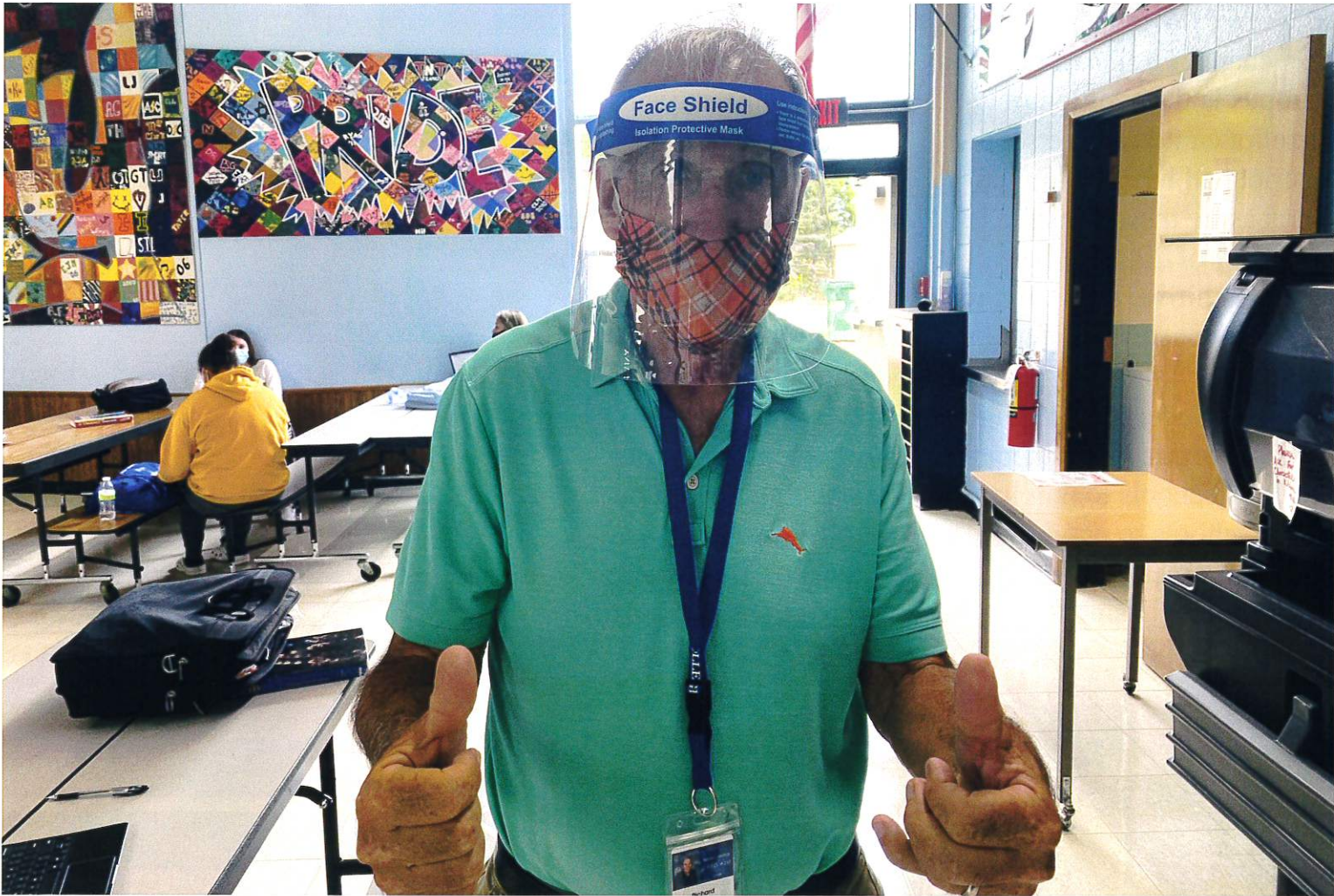
NFHS's streaming service, West Central families will be able to live stream school events. This includes not just sports but other live events, such as concerts and graduation ceremonies. The ability to live stream events will be very important as we get through the pandemic. Parents, grandparents, and family members with pre-existing conditions will be able to watch their students perform without putting themselves at risk.



To limit the spread of Covid-19, a touch-free water fountain was installed in the high school's hallway. While the new

water fountain was originally installed as a safety measure, it gives the campus a more modern look.

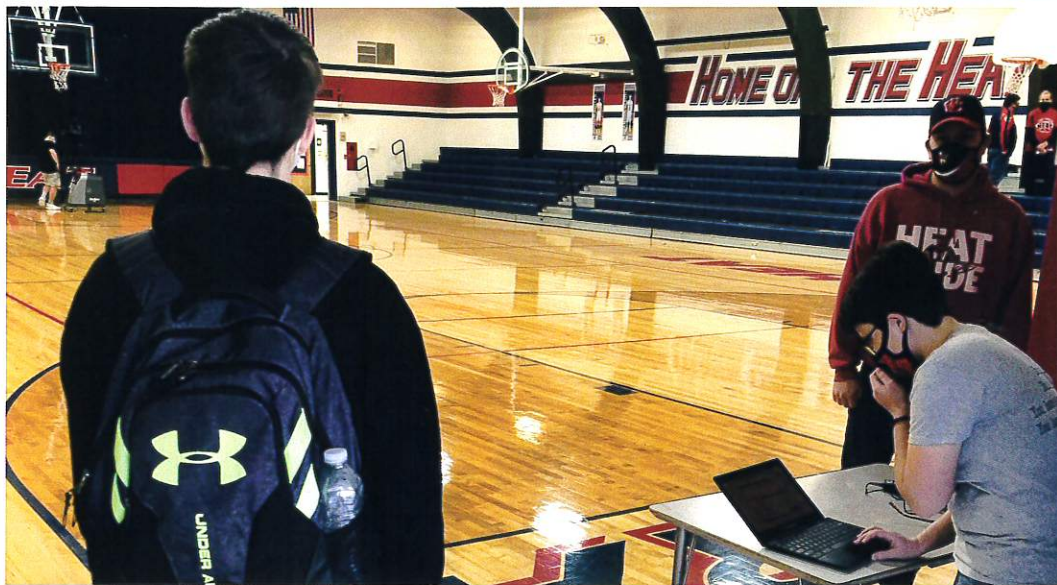

In an effort to reduce the spread of the virus, students' parents were required to certify that their children were symptom-free before they were allowed to even enter the building. Once inside, students were required to immediately utilize a new addition to our hallways: the hand sanitizer dispensers that were installed over the

summer. Touchless thermometers also became a part of a typical morning during the 2020 school year. As an added precaution, every self-certified student who entered the building was required to have their temperature taken by staff members. 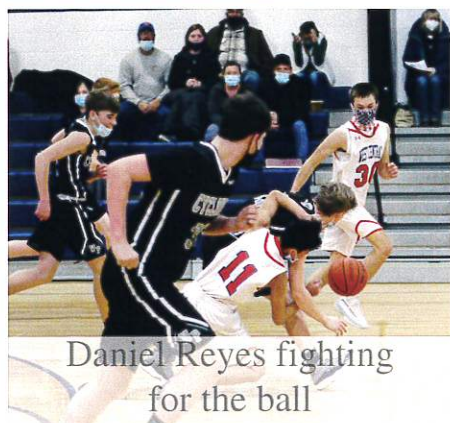

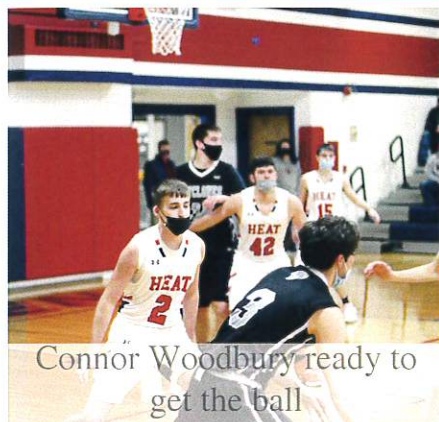

HOMECOMING WEEK

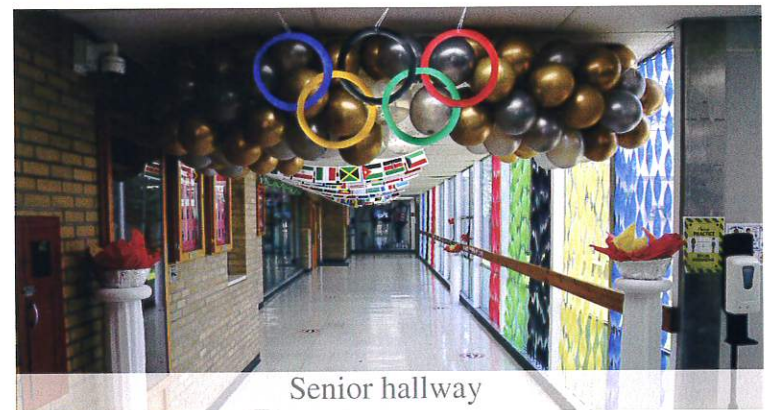
