John Simons—John is now a famous doctor who specializes in shoulder injuries.

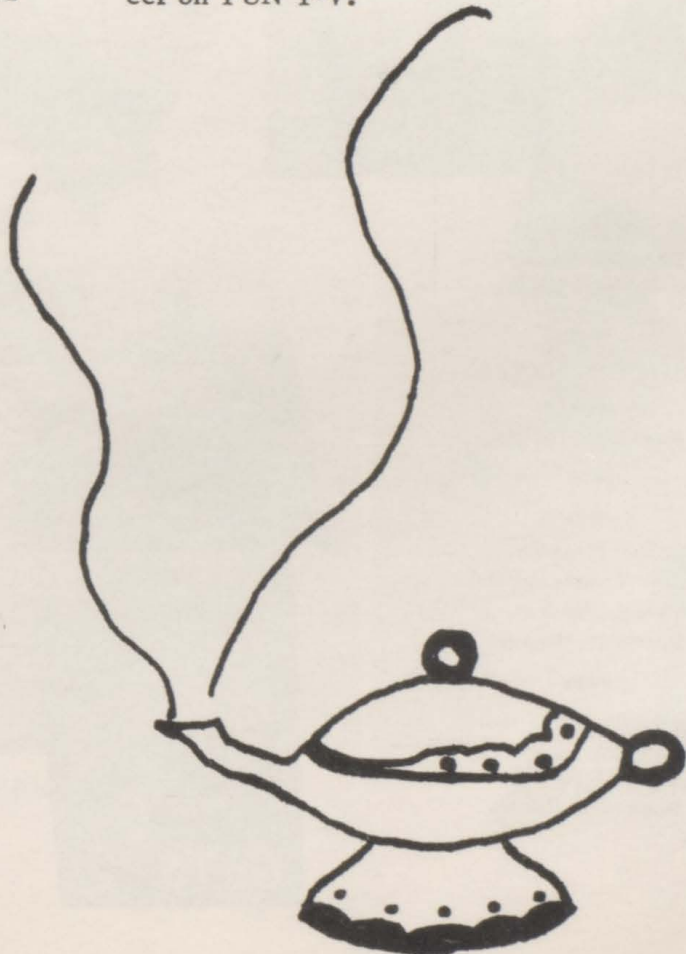

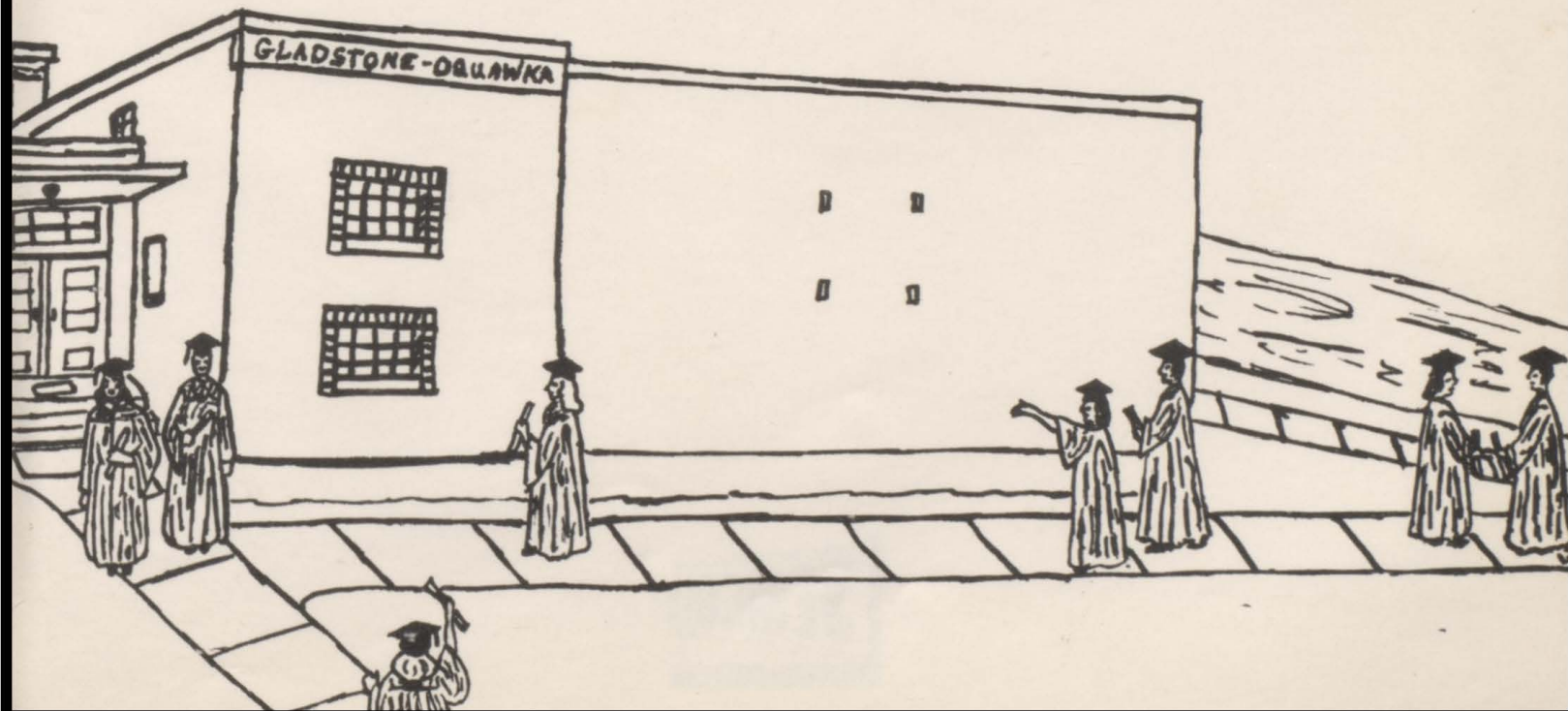
some of the hard earned money. Boy! What happened to that school year?

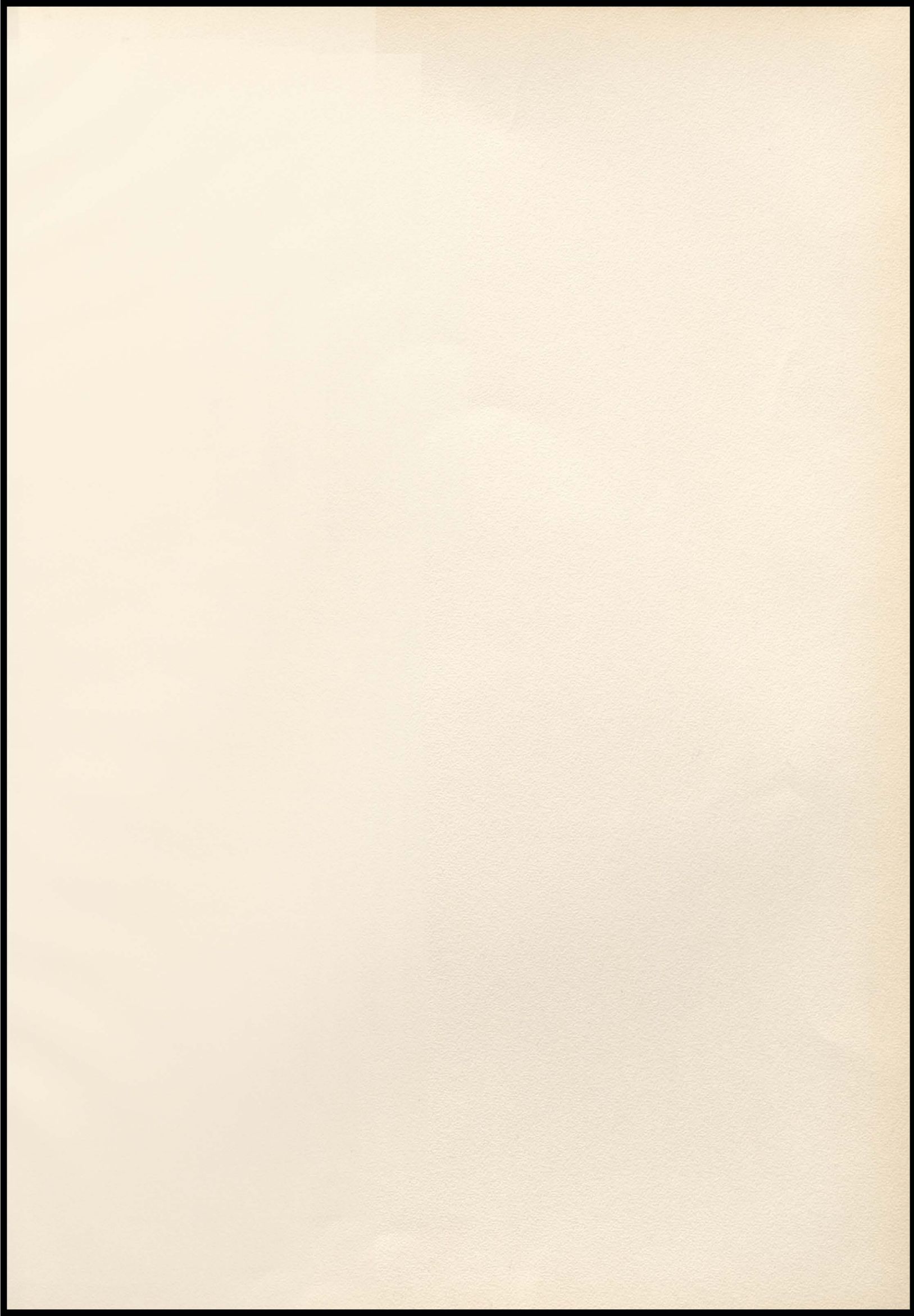

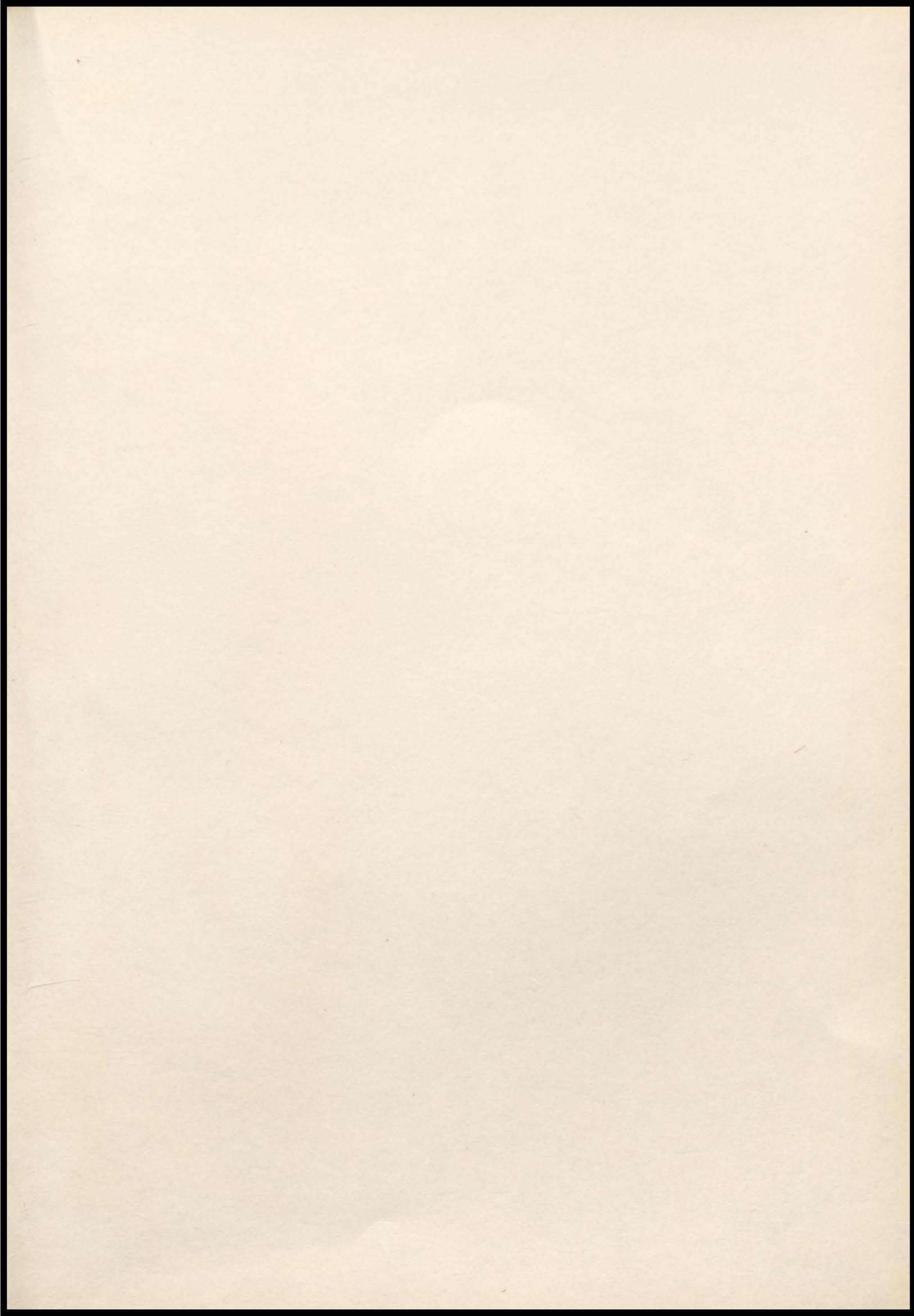
