Class History

This little ditty begins August 26, 1954, when forty pupils were to become Freshmen at G. & O. High. They were all scared to death at some of the horrible things that they had been told would happen. Soon after school started, they got accustomed to the routine of classes, and entered in the activities. To help guide them through the first year, they chose Mrs. Stripe and Mr. Mead as their sponsor. To begin the Sophomore year the following officers were chosen: President, Jack Hutson; Vice-President, Eddie Hills; Secretary, Cherrie Nicholas; Treasurer, Jim McIntire; and Student Council Representatives, Jack Hutson and Eddie Hills. Mr. Maynard was chosen to be our sponsor. The Homecoming King and Queen candidates were Cherrie Nicholas and Jim McIntire. The float won second place in the Homecoming parade. Fay Huffman was the FHA Formal Dance Queen candidate.

With heavy feet and light heads, thirty-two members returned in August 26, 1956, to start the Junior year. The sponsors were Mr. Maynard and Mrs. Dellitt. The class officers were as follows: President, Cherrie Nicholas; Vice-President, Jack Hutson; Secretary, Fay Huffman; Treasurer, Mary McOlgan; Reporter, Sandra McDavid; and Student Council Representatives, Cherrie Nicholas and Jim McIntire. Candidates for Homecoming King and Queen were Shirley Boughton and Tom Phipps. The float won second prize in the Homecoming parade. Joan Van Tine was FHA Formal Dance Queen candidate. The highlight of the Junior year was raising money to give the Seniors a banquet and prom they wouldn't forget. The theme was "Under the Sea" with music furnished by Mike Rufflo's Band. The prom was a big success with everyone having a very nice time.

On the last lap of the long mile of schooling, thirty pupils were to be members of the Senior class. The class sponsors were Mr. Maynard and Mrs. Huntoon. The officers for this year were: President, Jim McIntire; Vice-President, Tom Phipps; Secretary, Cherrie Nicholas; Treasurer, Eddie Hills; Reporter, Joan Van Tine; and Student Council Representatives, Jim McIntire and Jack Hutson. Homecoming King and Queen candidates were Linda Hamilton and Jim McIntire. Linda and Jim reigned over our Homecoming dance of 1957. The float won first prize in the Homecoming parade. Cherrie Nicholas was elected as one of the cheerleaders. All the members of the class worked very hard doing many things and sponsoring many activities to make money for the Senior trip. The banquet and prom was held in honor of the Seniors on May 10, 1958. The long-awaited final moment was May 24, 1958. Graduation was a sad occasion as classmates said good-bye for a long time and in a few moments it was all over, for these boys and girls who had worked and played together were starting a new life and looking forward to a new future. The Seniors enjoyed their trip to New York and with this, the Seniors are graduated with many memories of G-O High School.
