We often call him "coach" this year Although we know he is our principal dear.



We lost one member, Peggy Rankin, during our Freshman year.



To simplify the system of checking books in and out the job has been assigned to three librarians. Other librarians during the day check magazines and reference materials in and out and keep shelves in order.



The band also played at commencement.


