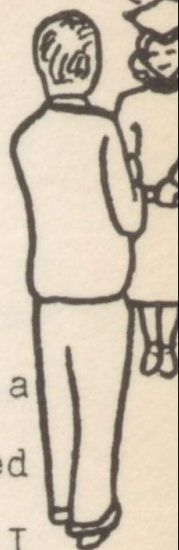
SENIOR PROPHECY

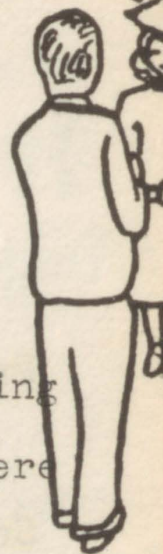
There were 19 prospective football players reporting to Coach Bowen the opening day of school. Among them were three lettermen returning from last year's squad.
