



We are proud to be associated with this progressive school, a school that has been interested in us as citizens as well as students.




We, the Senior Class, wish to dedicate the 1957 edition of the WEVER to two people.

Our junior year was very busy, What with play and carnival we were quite dizzy. The Junior-Senior Banquet was quite a chore, But no one can say that it was a bore.


Our first three years went very fast. We were Sophisticated Seniors at last. First graduation and then the class trip, Into many interesting things we did dip.







During the first semester we lost Eddy Lenz and gained and lost Terry Wilson. This leaves us twelve classmates to look forward to our Junior year at Media High.






Our advisors: Mrs. Mayhew and Mr. Sibbing. Mrs. Mayhew resigned March 1 and Miss Willner replaced her.



Our shop was busy during the year, many metal and wood-working projects being completed.







On Award Night Pep Club felts were awarded to those girls who were active participants throughout the school year.



The purpose of the Girls Athletic Association is to promote good sportsmanship and interest in athletics, both as a spectator and as a participant, and to encourage good health habits.


