National Honor Society



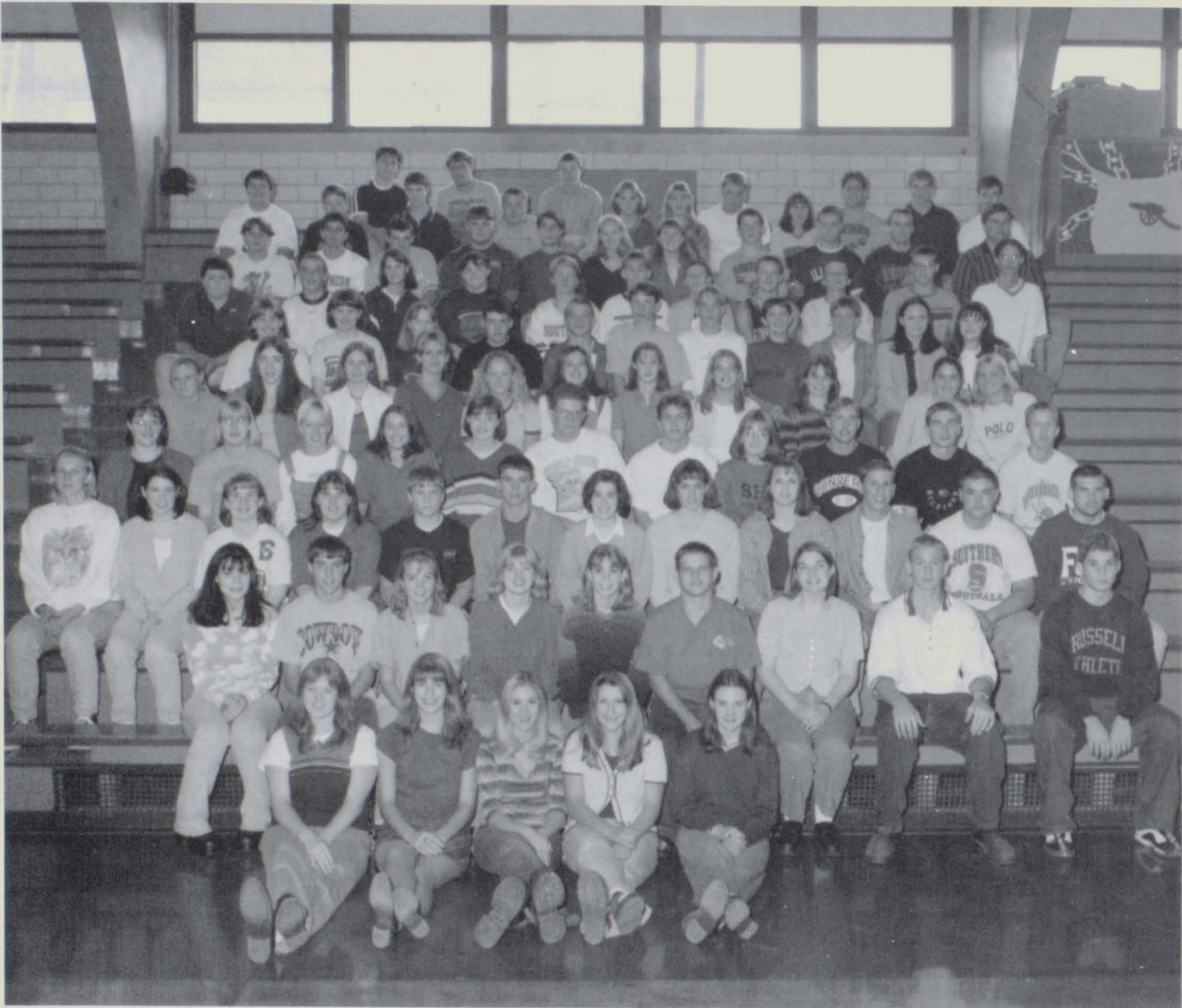
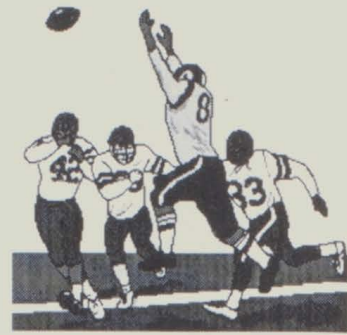

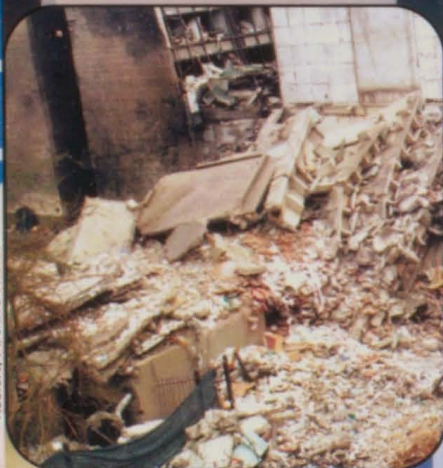

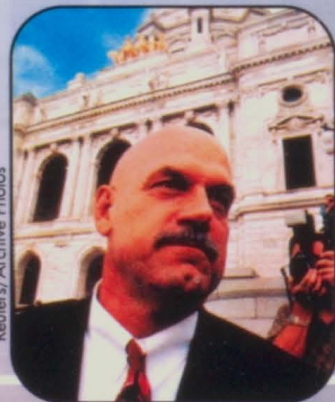

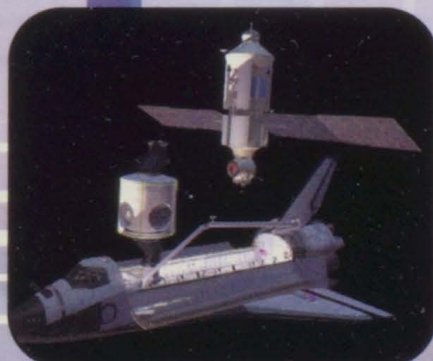

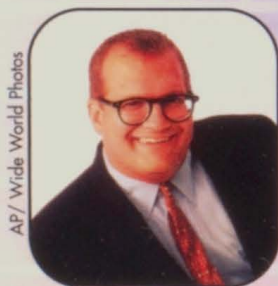

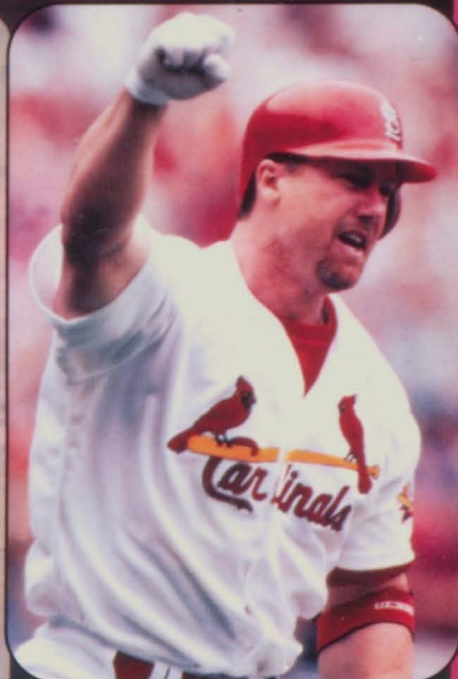

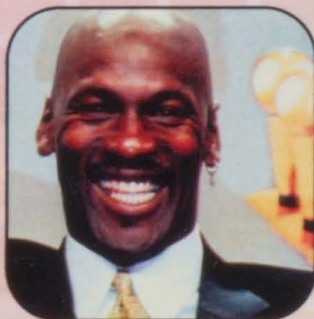
