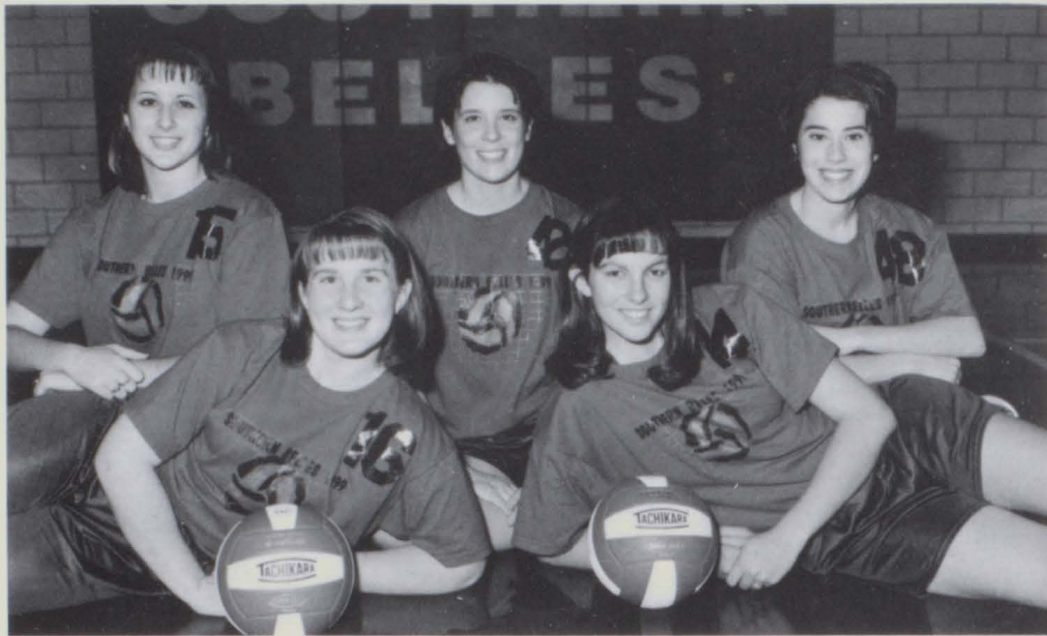
Channon Corzatt: My most memorable moment was winning the Knoxville tournament this year because, it all came together that day and we played like a team.

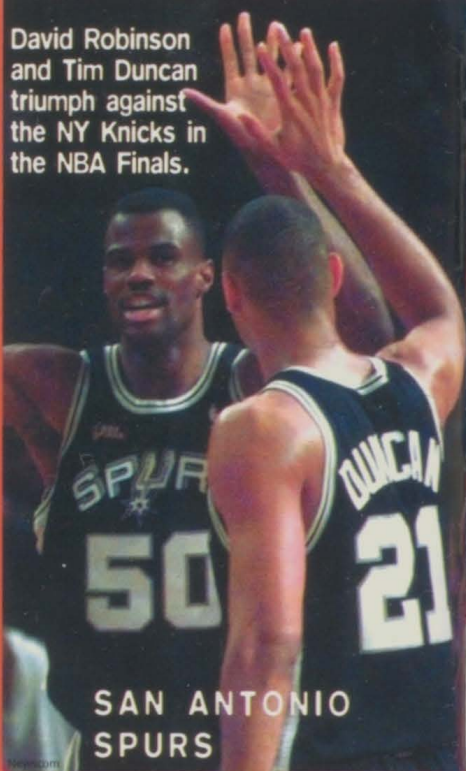

TLC returns to the hip-hop scene with "Fan Mail," featuring the singles "Come On Down" and "No Scrubs."

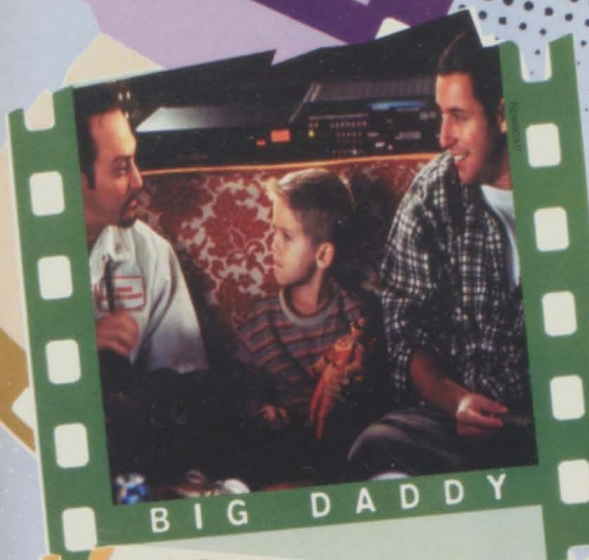
