To the Sophomores, we will our importance and ability to handle underclassmen.

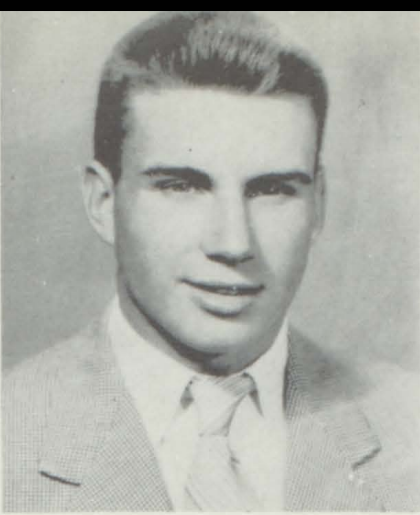
To the Freshmen, we will our ability to get along with faculty members.

COMMERCIAL DEPARTMENT ORGANIZE COOPERATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAM

The Business Education Department, in cooperation with the Stronghurst Business Community is offering a work experience program to its students.

Pupils take their regular high school courses during one half of each day. The remainder of the day is spent working in an office. For their job training and laboratory experiences the student receives training wages commensurate with beginning salaries in their chosen occupations. As they receive instruction and experience, their training wages may be advanced in line with their progress and abilities.

PUPILS ELIGIBLE for the Program. **SENIORS.** One year of typing, one semester of bookkeeping, and one semester of office practice. Students must have above average grades in the business subjects, and at least average grades in all other subjects. Also students accepting work must maintain their school subject grades, taking all tests and completing all work recommended by the instructor.

AGREEMENT. Students accepting work must agree to work on Saturdays, extra days available, and for at least one year after they are graduated from high school.

GRADES: The business teacher gives the employer certain forms to fill in at regular periods, rating the student according to attitudes and efficiency. The teacher collects these forms and together with the work and attitudes of the student at school, a grade is determined.

Winnie Long and Rose Marie Brennan have been granted permission to take part in this program, and they work at Davison's Motor Sales and the Stronghurst Bank respectively. The Department is hoping these girls do a far better than average job, the reason being that the Board of Education and the Administrator will approve the departments continuing its work experience program.
