On November 1st, seven officers, our chaptermothers, and sponsor traveled to Davenport to appear on WOC TV on the program "Especially For You."

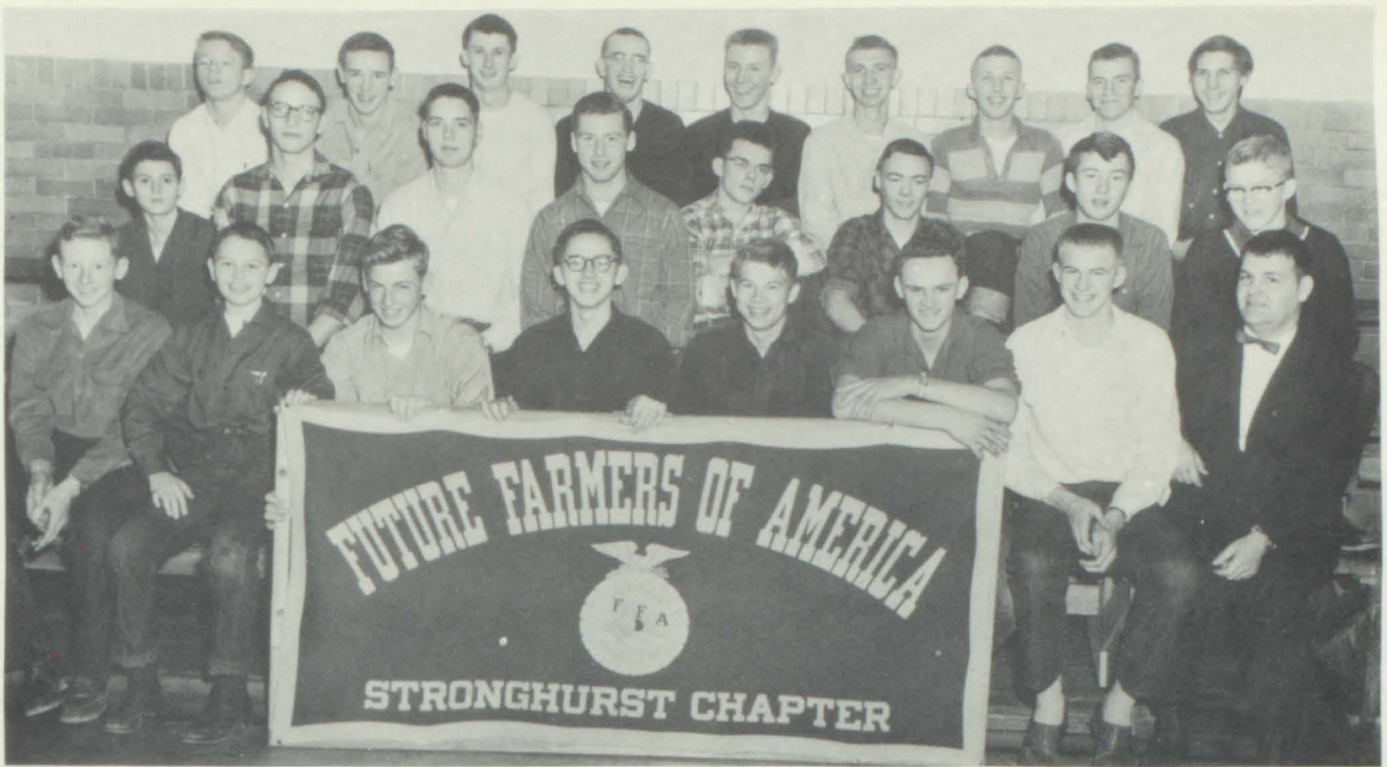
Our Mother-Daughter Banquet was held in December with the F.F.A. boys doing the serving. Our theme was "Winter Wonderland."
