We sponsored a "Twirp Dance" which was very good as a money-making project.

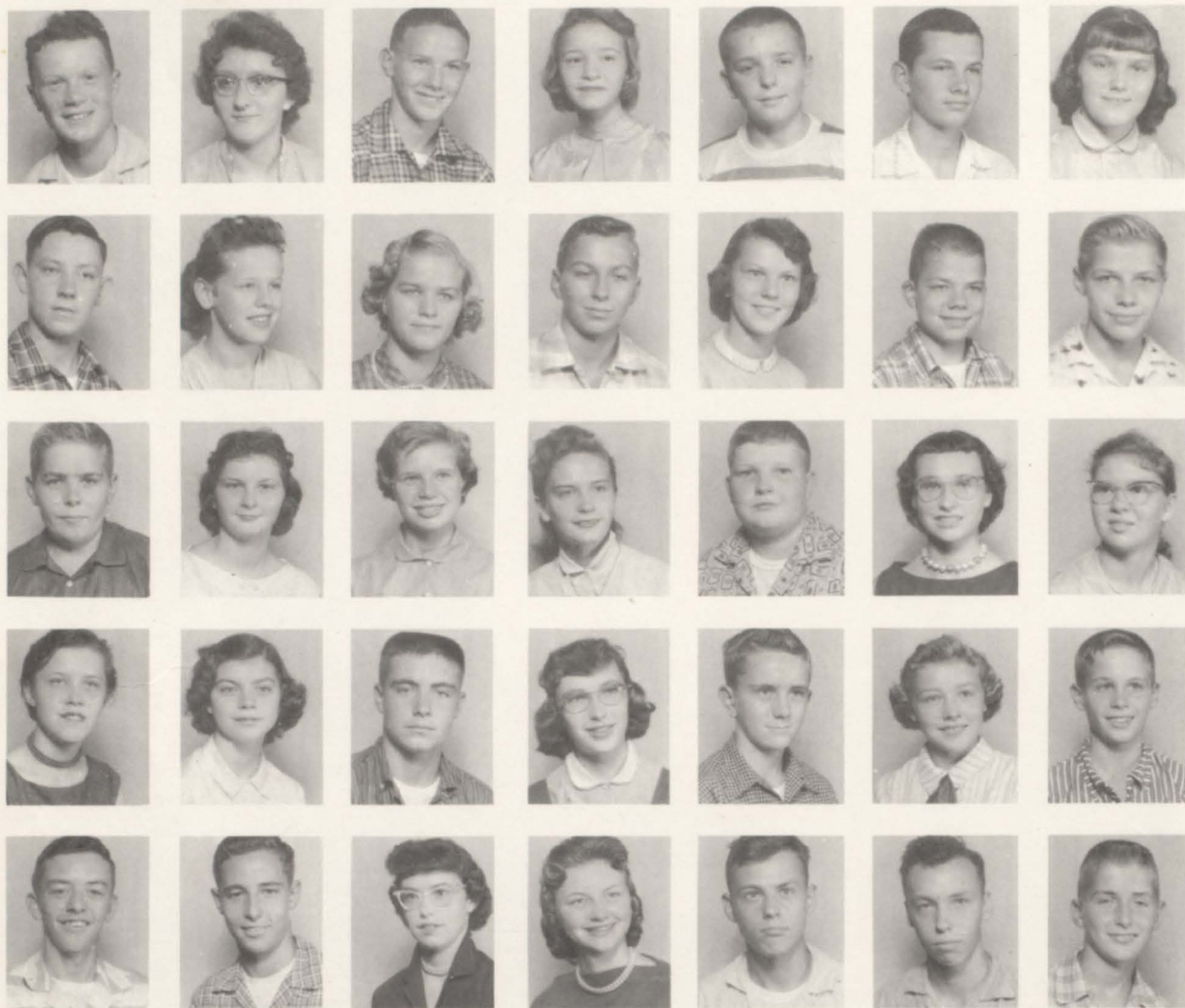

A pep rally followed the parade. This took place on the football field, with Coach McIntyre, and Sup't. Dennison making pep talks. The high school band played to give the group added steam.

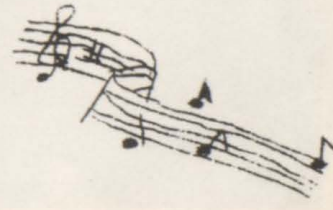
The Trojans won the game that evening by defeating Avon 20-6. A parade and half time show was presented by the Marching Band under the direction of Mr. Don Jones.

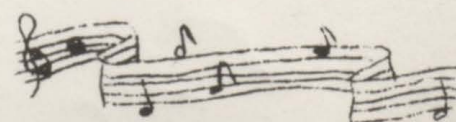
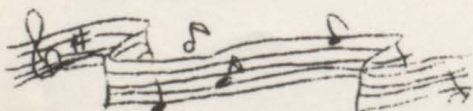
### MARION HULETT NAMED SECTION 9 PRESIDENT

## JUNIOR-SENIOR PROM A BIG SUCCESS

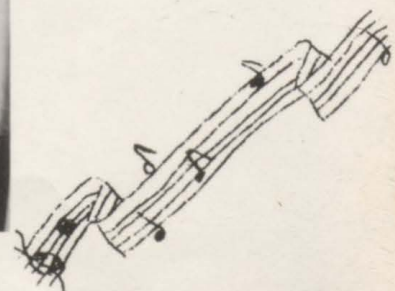
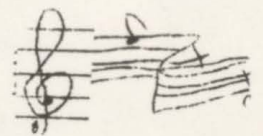
