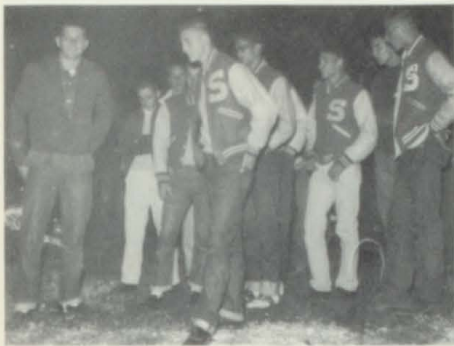
The Stronghurst Trojans dropped the curtain on the 1958 football season Friday night in a home game, romping to a 41-0 victory over Warren.

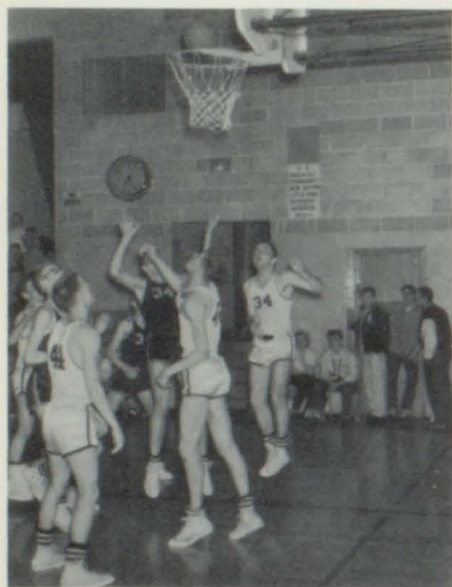

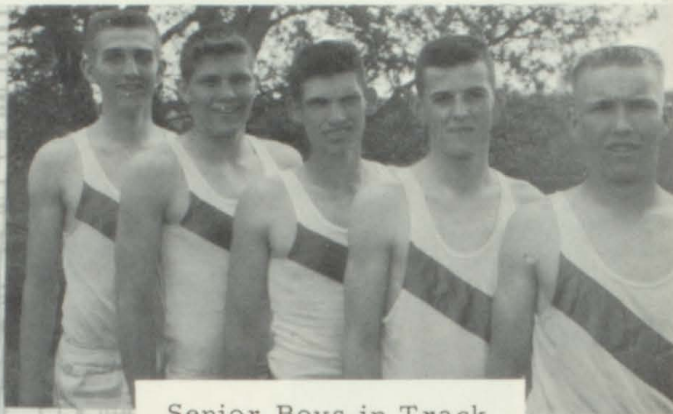
