JUNIOR SENIOR PROM

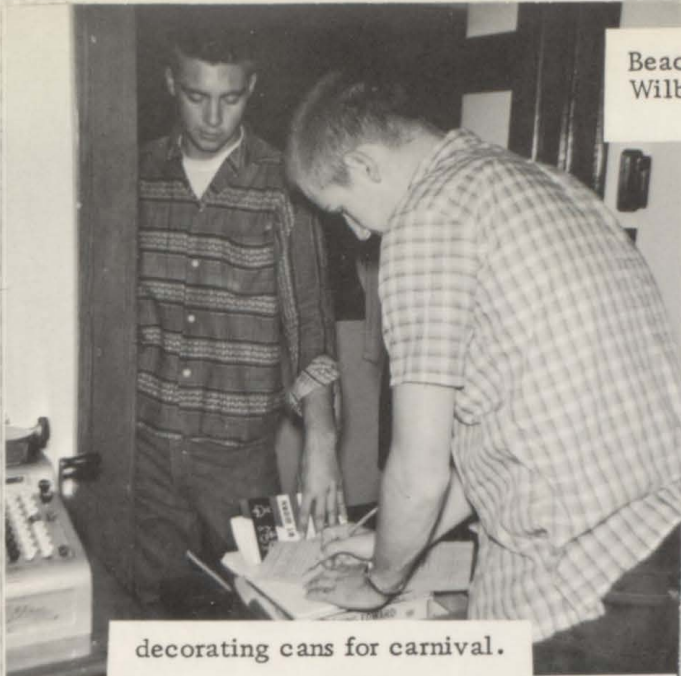

Homecoming activities will be completed with the dance from 9:30 to 12:30. At 11:00 the announcing of the 1959 King and Queen and their crowning will take place.

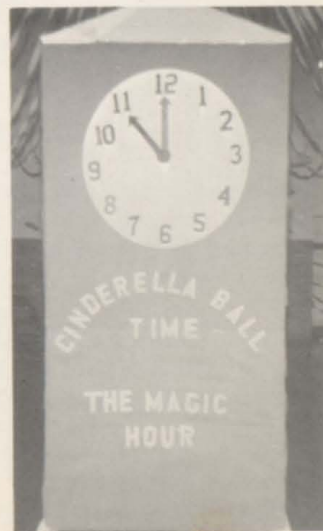

Stronghurst Junior Varsity Wins Again

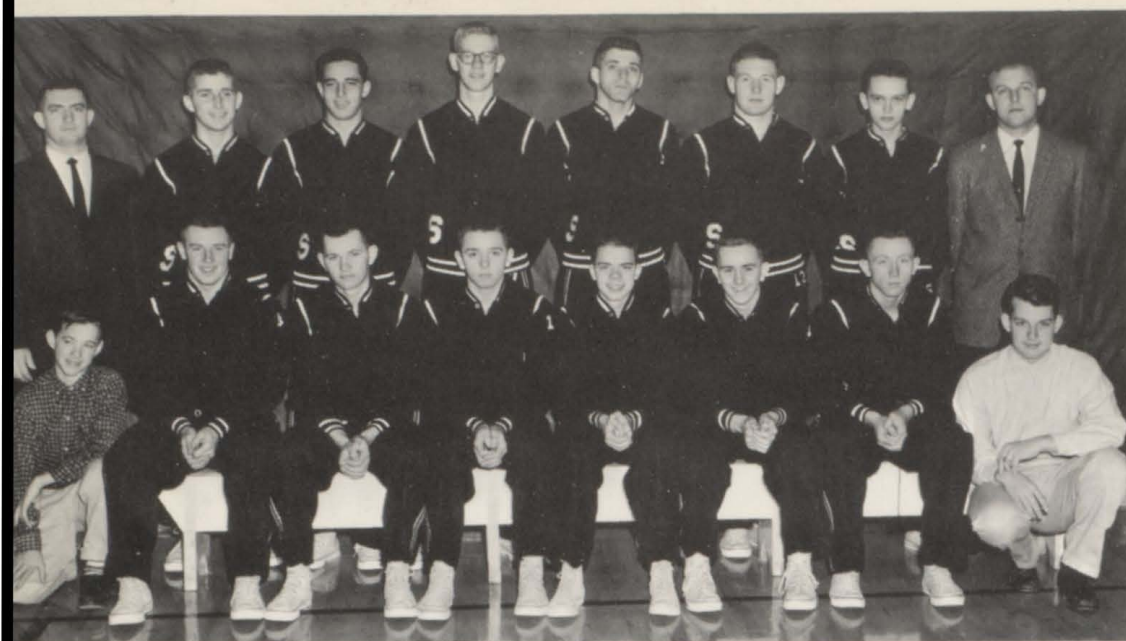
