



Entering SCHS with vision somewhat narrow, the students learn to focus their sights on broader goals as they pass from course to course, from class to class.







Nolen came up with his record breaking mile run to account for the Trojan's only first place.


Marvin Kern, senior miler, for the Trojans, ran a fine race to win the second heat of the mile, but finished just off the fifth place time.
