Defense, Scoring, Size Pay Off in 19-0 Record

STRONGHURST, Ill.—Defense, scoring balance, depth, and size appear to be the principal factors in Stronghurst's emergence as a basketball leader this year.

Sailing along with a 19-0 record, the Trojans of first-year Coach John Abramczyk have surprised everyone, including themselves.

Two years ago, they posted a 6-18 record followed by a 3-18 mark last season.

One of the big reasons for this year's success is "our defense," Abramczyk says.

"THE BOYS have developed a great deal of pride in holding the opposition to the least number of points possible. And it has won several games for us when we weren't hitting."

Stronghurst has held 19 foes to an average of less than 50 points per game with a sticky man-to-man defense.

Balance is another strong point of this team. Seven players share the major portion of the playing time with three of them holding a scoring average in double figures.

Six different boys have been high-point man for us at one point during the year, Abramczyk said.

CAPTAIN Junior Cargill, junior guard who is playing his third varsity season, is the scoring leader of the team, averaging 13.6 points per game.

Last year he led the squad in almost every department. This season he is still the top scorer, but with a lower average, but also leads in assists.

Alan Ferguson is second in

scoring. The 6-2 sophomore forward also leads the team in rebounds and has the second best percentage from the field (50.3).

Darrell Burrell, another junior, plays sixth man on the squad, but still ranks third in scoring with a 10.4 average. Abramczyk calls the 5-10 guard "as valuable to our team as a good relief pitcher is to a baseball team."

ED SCHROEDER, a Junior who starts at guard opposite Cargill, is the smallest man on the team. However, his assets include best defensive player, top ballhandler, and a 7.3 scoring average.

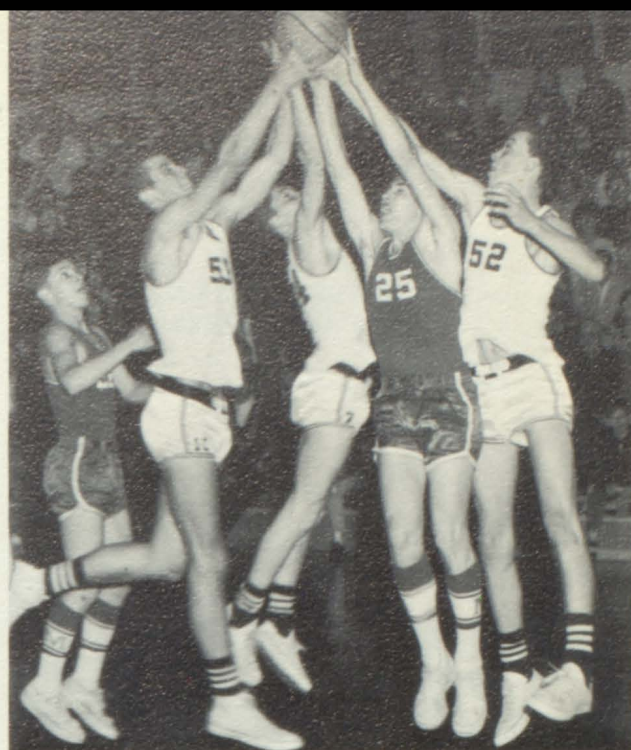
Robert Morgan, 6-1½ forward, is a letterman with a 7.3 scoring average. The best shooter on the team, he is one of two seniors among the top seven men.

Senior John Yaley, the second tallest man on the team at 6-5½, plays center, and does an excellent job of rebounding.

Rod Nichols, the back-up man for Yaley, stands 6-6½ and is only a junior. He has hauled down almost 150 rebounds and has a 5.1 scoring average.

"THE FUTURE looks bright," Abramczyk said. "Not only do we have five of our top seven men back next year, but we also have a top-notch sophomore group coming up."

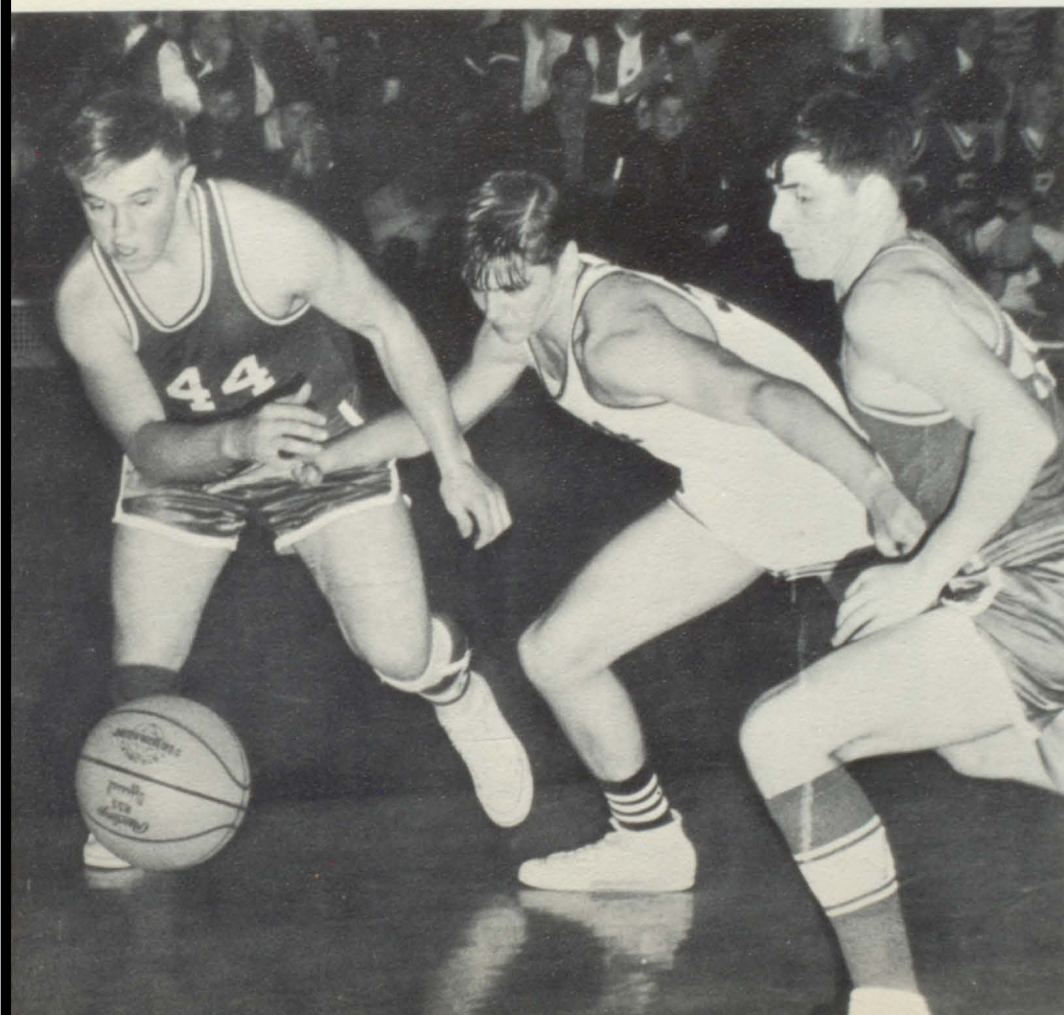

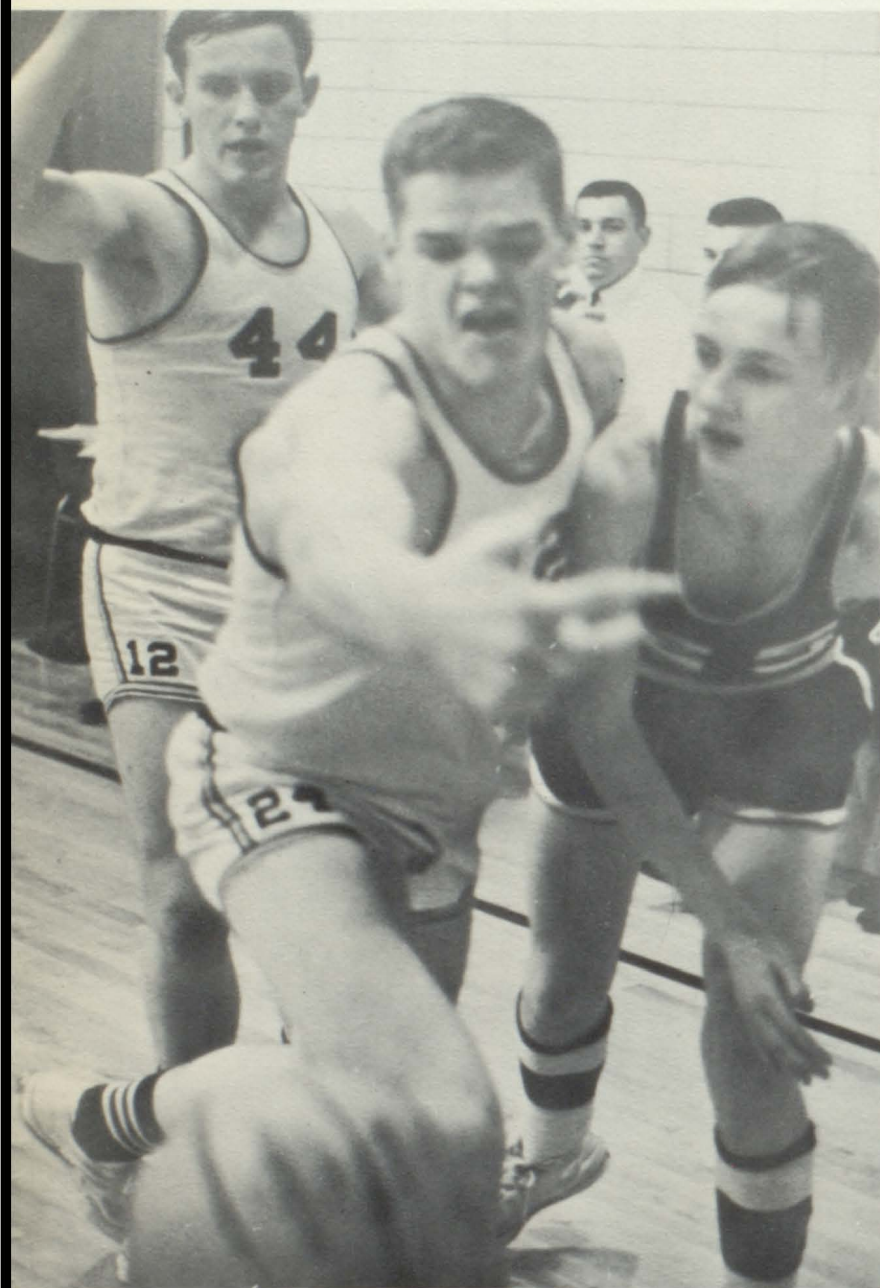

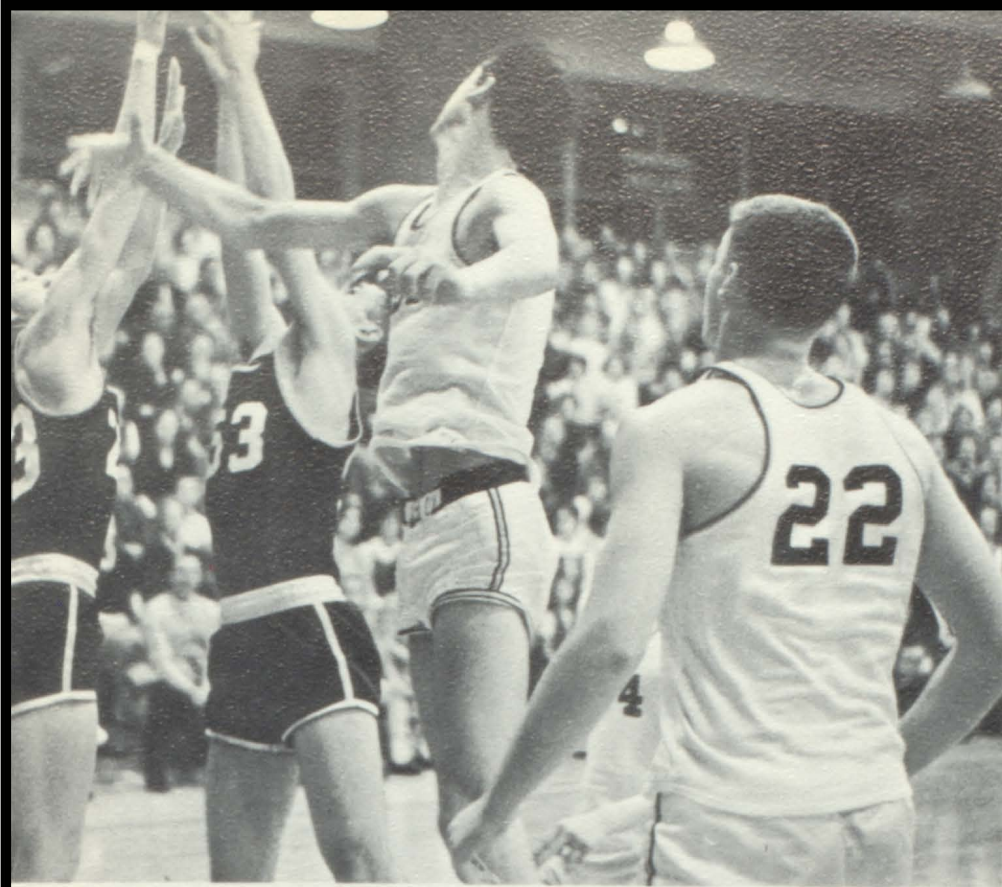

This year's basketball teams were probably the most successful in recent years. The won-lost record of the Junior Varsity and Varsity totaled 37 wins and 9 losses. The Junior Varsity came through with second place in the conference with Warren being the winner. The Varsity won the Roseville Tournament, Bi-County Tournament, and tied for Bi-County Conference winner with Warren and Roseville. Upon winning the two tournaments, they posted a twenty game winning streak which earned the

team 1 of 3 undefeated records of the entire state.

Later in the season, after three defeats to LaHarpe, Roseville, and Warren, they came back in the District Tourney and clobbered Media only to be defeated by Roseville. Roseville went on to lose in the final game to Western.

The response to the successful season by the student body and the people of Stronghurst was overwhelming.

Homecoming activities got underway on October 14, 1966, with the traditional snake dance uptown, followed by the bonfire and pep rally at the school.

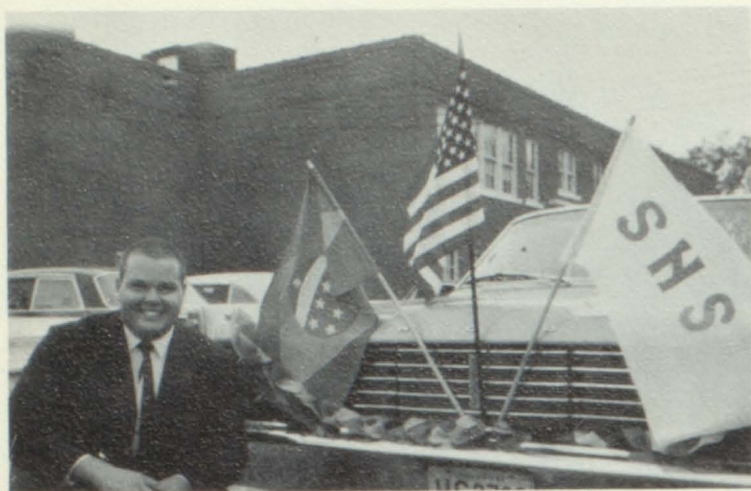

That evening the football game with York-

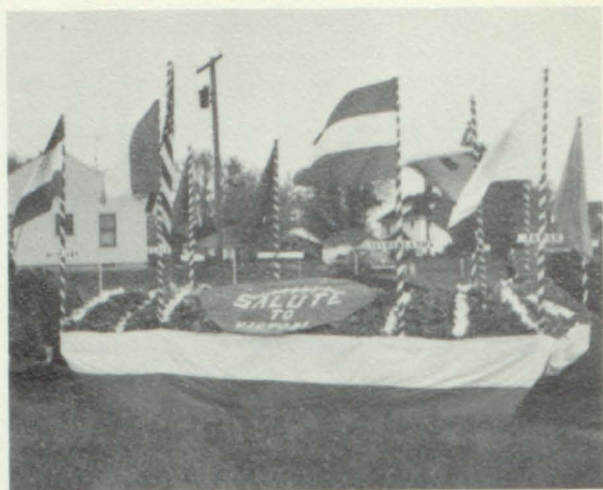
wood proved to be a real thriller, however the mighty Trojans suffered a 7-6 defeat.

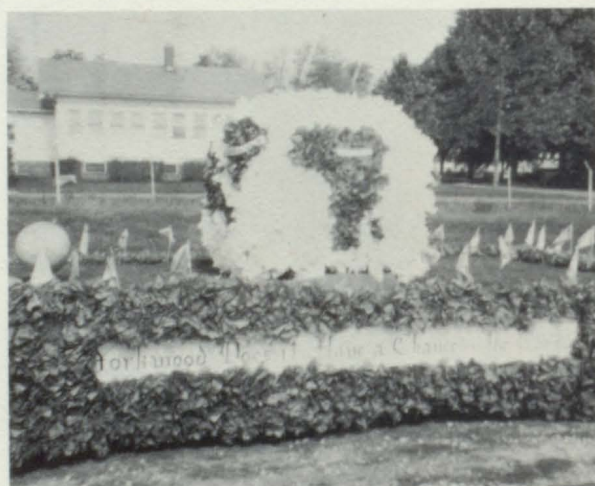

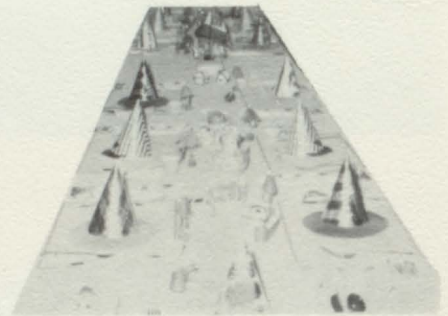

Junior-Senior Prom

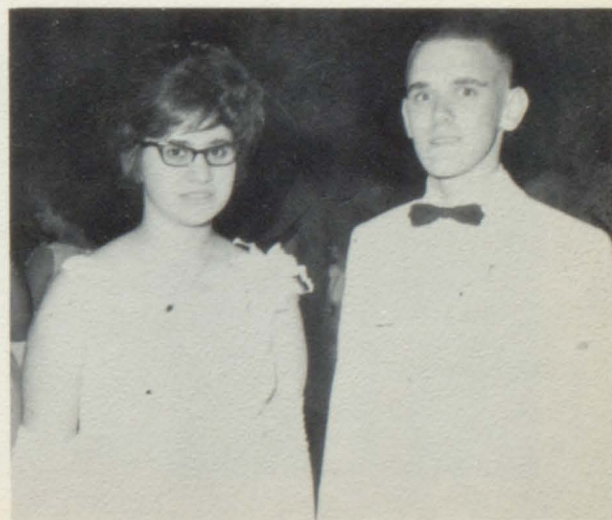
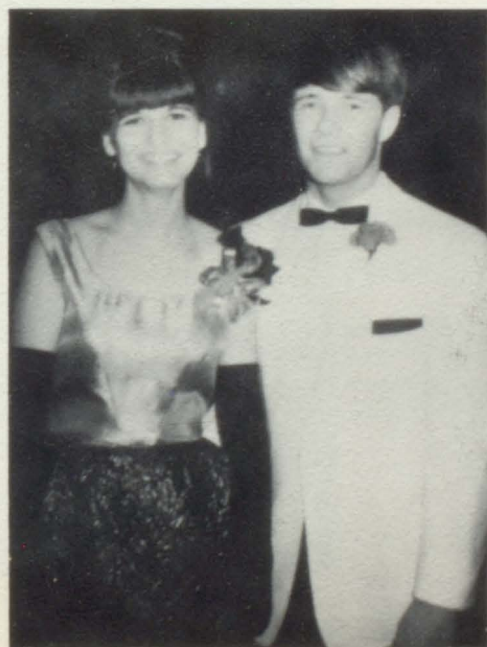
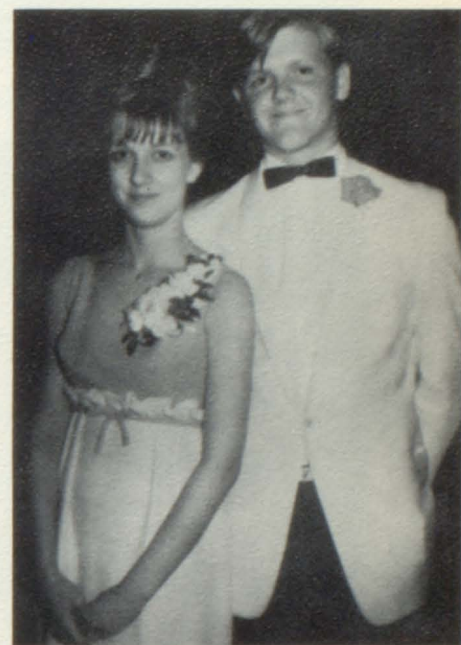
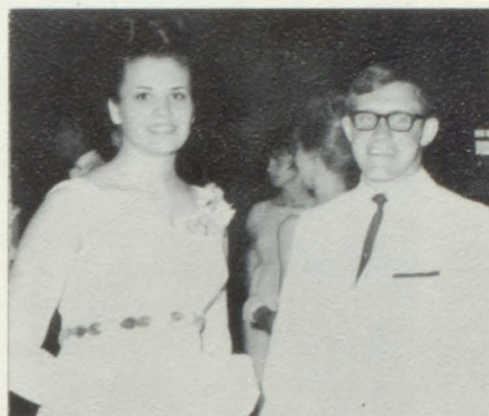
