In Bi-County conference games at Warren last night Union won the varsity game by the score of 65 to 63 and the also won the frosh-soph game 44 to 43.

The varsity game was a great battle between two boys in the conference. Rodgers of Warren won by scoring 28 points, Goff's 24, but Goff had 44 percent from the field. Rodgers shot 5 of 8 freethrows.

Cheryl plans to attend Western Illinois University where she will major in physical education.



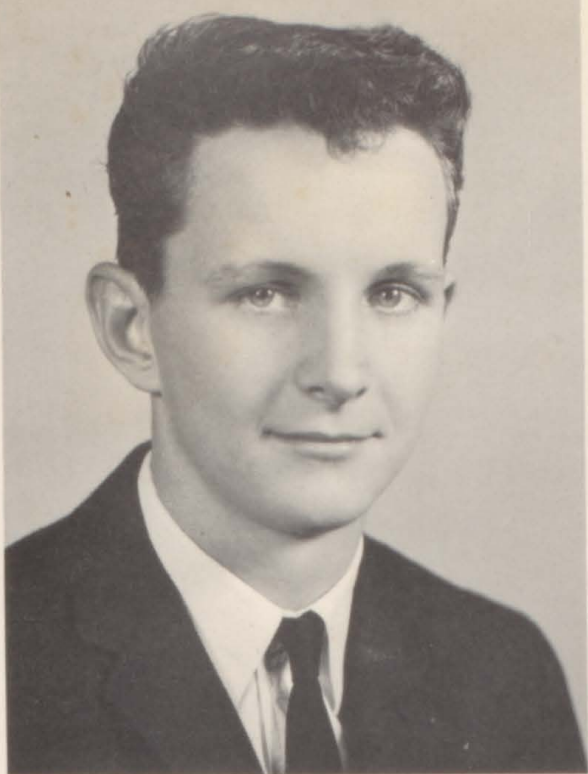
