Union's Sweet Sixteen



Union High School's track squad--labeled the "Sweet Sixteen" by their coach Larry Sterett, due to the number on the squad--consists of an even dozen varsity members and four freshmen. Of the dozen, seven are seniors, including three--Dick Stoneking, Mickey Cameron, and Kent Seymour--out for the first time this year. The remaining four--Gary Gibb, James Green, Scott Kelly, and Randy Steele are returning lettermen. The remaining five members of the Union thinclads include three juniors--Bob Bailey, Lyle Smith, and Dave Wegman, and two sophomores--Mark Olson and Mike Ruberg.

On May 4, 1971, this thinclad squad of a dozen brought the Bi-County track championship back to Henderson County and Union High School by winning the Bi-County Track and Field Meet at Roseville by a score of 59 1/2 points to the 36 1/4 points of the nearest competitor, Warren High School. Others scores included Stronghurst 36, Yorkwood 26, LaHarpe 26, Roseville 22, Media 9 and R.M.A. 9.

In winning the meet the Union squad garnered seven gold medals, two silver medals, and a bronze medal, plus one fourth place, four fifth places and a tie for fifth in the high jump. The Union team of Gibb, Steele, Ruberg, and Bailey won the 880 yd. relay in 1:38.0 and the team of Steele, Stoneking, Bailey, and Smith won the mile relay in 3:37.9 setting a new record. The old record was 3:38.1, set by Roseville in 1968.

Gold medal winners included Bob Bailey in the low hurdles, Lyle Smith in the long jump and high hurdles, Dave Wegman in the mile run, Randy Steele in the pole vault, and the 880 and mile relay teams. The 880 yd. relay team missed the record by one second, but did receive the traveling trophy for this event. Silver medal winners included Gary Gibb in the long jump and Lyle Smith in the low hurdles. Dave Wegman picked up a bronze medal for the 880 yard run. Other point getters adding to the total score included Mickey Cameron, James Green, Mark Olson, and Dick Stoneking in individual events.

The four freshmen--Paul Carner, Dan Millar, Kevin Shauman, and Mike Torrance--picked up 19 points to tie with Roseville for second place in the Freshman Division. (Warren won the Freshman Division with 64 points.) Dan Millar placed fifth in the 100 yard dash, fourth in the 120 yard low hurdles, and third in the long jump. Kevin Shauman placed third in the shot put, and Mike Torrance won the high jump and placed third in the 880 yard run. The team placed fifth in the 880 yard Freshman Relay.

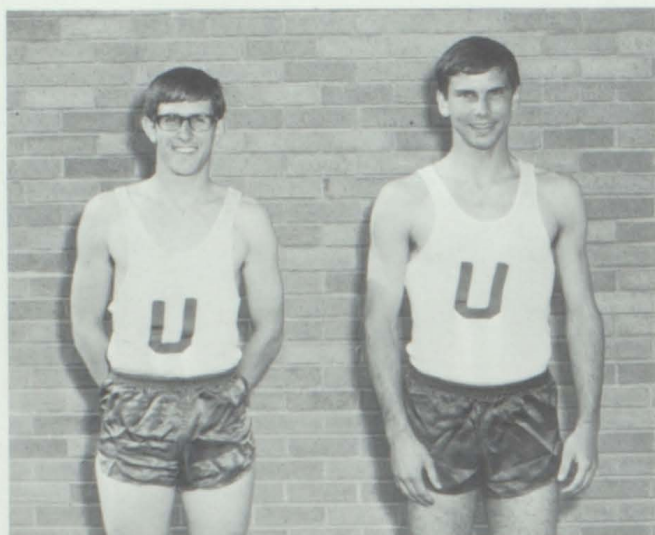

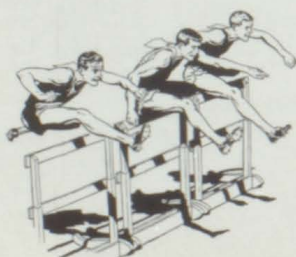

On May 2, 1971, a smorgasbord was held for the Union track squad at the Coach & Four restaurant. All sixteen squad members--Bob Bailey, Mickey Cameron, Paul Carner, Gary Gibb, James Green, Scott Kelly, Dan Miller, Marc Olson, Mike Ruberg, Kent Seymour, Kevin Shauman, Randy Steele, Lyle Smith, Dick Stoneking, Mike Torrance, and Dave Wegman--plus manager Rick Blythe, and statistician Deborah Sterett were in attendance.

After the meal, Coach Sterett briefly reviewed the record accomplishments of the season, and presented varsity letters and special awards in the form of small plaques to the individuals and teams breaking existing school records. Plaques were presented to Bob Bailey for his low hurdle record of 21.1 seconds set at Fort Madison, Randy Steele for his pole vault of 11'6" set at the District in Galesburg, Dave Wegman for his mile record of 4:49.0 set at Carthage, Lyle Smith for the record long jump of 22'3" set at the District, Mickey Cameron for his 100 yard dash record of 10.3 set at Carthage, the mile relay team, Steele, Stoneking, Bailey, and Smith, for its record 3:37.9 set at the Bi-County, the 880 relay team, Gibb, Stoneking, Ruberg, and Bailey, for its record 1:37.1 set at Carthage, the mile medley team, Ruberg, Seymour, Stoneking, and Wegman, for its record 3:56.2 set at the Roseville Relays, and the low hurdle shuddle team, Bailey, Ruberg, Stoneking, and Smith, for its 59.9 record set at the Roseville Relays. Mention was made that the 440 relay team of Cameron, Ruberg, Olson, and Stoneking had established a school record of 48.0 seconds for this event at Keokuk.

In setting some of the school records, the Union squad had also placed Union's name in the record lists at other schools, as follows: Gary Gibb established the long jump record of 19'6 1/2" at the Carthage Relays, and the Mile Relay team established the record at the same meet of 3:39.0, while the same team set the new Bi-County record of 3:37.9.
