## OVER OPPONENTS

Track practice started on March 1, 1972 with 31 reporting, including returning lettermen Bob Bailey, Lyle Smith, Dave Wegman, Clark Kelly, Marc Olson, and Mike Ruberg.

On April 14 we journeyed to Keokuk for the relays and came away with three trophys--2nd in the Class B section of the meet, plus the 400 yard low hurdle shuttle and the mile relay. The shuttle team consisted of Bob Bailey, Lyle Smith, Dan Millar and Rodney Slover and the winning time was 49.9 seconds. The mile relay team consisted of Bob Bailey, Dale Kruse, Dan Millar, and Lyle Smith, and the winning time was $3: 46.4$. Rushville won the meet with 46 points, and Union edged our Mediapolis, Iowa by 40 points to 39 , with eight other schools trailing behind.

At the Carthage Relays Union picked up 52 points and another 2 nd place trophy by beating out Rushville and Carthage, and 15 other schools. Lyle Smith set a new meet record in the high hurdles of 15.4 seconds, and tied his own school record. Lyle also set a new long jump record for the meet with a leap of $21^{\prime} 1-5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$. The mile medley team of Dale Kruse, Lyle Jones, Dan Millar, and Dave Wegman picked up gold medals, ad did the mile relay team of Bob Bailey, Dale Kruse, Dan Millar, and Lyle Smith.

On May 2 we traveled to Roseville for the Bi-County meet and hopes of winning it. When the final event was over--the pole vault--we had been edged out of the winners circle by Southern by 2 points- 59 to 57 . The freshmen came through with flying colors and won their division by a score of 41-1/3 points; ten points over second place.

On May 5 we were at Monmouth for the First Annual Open Track and Field Meet. No team scores were officially kept, although we had the second highest number of points, behind Monmouth, with Lyle Jones, Lyle Smith, Marc Olson, Dave Wegman, Dale Kruse, Mike Ruberg, Dan Millar, and Clark Kelly earning points.

We spent the next day at the Rockridge Relays. We came home with medals from the long jump, the sprint medley and the mile relay. The relay teams consisted of Bob Bailey, Lyle Jones, Mike Ruberg, and Lyle Smith in the sprint, and bob Bailey, Dale Kruse, Mike Ruberg, and Lyle Smith in the Mile. Total points came to 53 , good enough for fourth place.

At the Roseville Relays on May 9, we amassed 30 points. The low hurdle shuttle relay team of Bob Bailey, Rod Slover, Dan Millar, and Lyle Smith set a new school record of 59.1 seconds, and we picked up points in the distance medley, 880 varsity relay, mile relay, pole vault, and long jump.

On May 19, we journeyed to Galesburg for the District Meet. Lyle Smith placed second in the long jump, and thus qualified for the State. He also placed fourth in the high hurdles. Bob Bailey placed third in the 180 low hurdles, and set a new school record in this event of 20.7 seconds, but missed qualifying for State by about half-a-stride. Dave Wegman set a new school record in the mile run of $4: 47.3$, breaking his own record of $4: 49.0$ set last year.

At this point, in late May, we have only the Ft. Madison Relays left. In our dual meets we have outscored our opponents by $447-1 / 2$ to $197-1 / 2$, or better than 2 points for every one scored against us. Overall we have scored 832-1/2 points, and Bob Bailey, Lyle Smith, Lyle Jones, Clark Kelly, Terry Krow, Dale Kruse, Dan Millar, Marc Olson, Bob Price, Bruce Ruberg, Mike Ruberg, Rod Slover, Kevin Shauman, Frank Stevens, Dave Wegman, and John Wegman have lettered. The top five scorers in top to bottom order include Lyle Smith with 189-1/2 points, Bob Bailey with 85-1/2 points, Lyle Jones with 85 points, Dale Kruse with $70-3 / 4$ points, and Dave Wegman with $70-1 / 2$ points. But, while not scoring as many points, the remaining members of the Union thinclads all helped to make the season a good one. Recognition is also due to statistician Deborah Sterett for three years of keeping the score book at the meets, and to manager Jack Olson.
