Union track practice started on March 4, 1974, with twenty-five prospects reporting to Coach Sterett, including lettermen Terry Krow, Dan Millar, Rod Slover, Kevin Shauman and John Wegman. Mike Torrance and Bruce Ruberg were out due to injuries. Among the prospects were freshmen Bob Koopmans, Terry Meyer, John Peterson, and Scott Rhinehart, and all four were still with us when the season ended on May 21, following the Ft. Madison Relays. Our first meet was on March 8 at W. T. U., with Rod Slover and John Wegman participating. Rod placed third in the triple jump with a distance of 38' 11-3/4". We also participated in 13 other meets this year, and had one dual meet with Notre Dame cancelled on us twice, due to weather. (The 1974 season had to be one of the wettest in Union Thinclad history.) Overall, we scored 444 points, some of which were in rather large meets. One of the most memorable, and the wettest, was the Bi-County Conference meet at Roseville, where we placed third, but only missed winning the title again by 2-1/6 points. (Warren had 59-1/6, Southern 58, and Union 57.) On May 17, the District meet was held at Galesburg, and Rod Slover qualified for the State meet in the long jump with a jump of 21' 10", for second place, only 1/4" behind the first place winner. On May 23. Rod and Coach Sterett left for Charleston, Illinois, where Rod was to participate on May 24. On May 27, a Track Banquet was held at the Oquawka Dinner, and the following boys were awarded letters: Kevin Barker, Sam Bigger, Terry Krow, Don Mickey, Dan Millar, John Peterson, Kevin Shauman, Rod Slover, John Wegman, and Bill Seitz. Miquel Galvan, our exchange student from Mexico City, and Jeanne Graham, manager and statistician, were also awarded letters. Rod Slover was presented the Annual High Score Award for a total of 135-1/4 points. Three school records were broken this year. Kevin Shauman broke the discus record with a throw of 132' to better the old record of 127' 10" set in 1964. Rod Slover broke his own triple jump record with a new distance of 40' 4", and he hopes to better it next year. Rod also established a new record in the 330 vard low hurdles with a time of 41.5 seconds. At the last meet of the year (Ft. Madison) the relay team of Dan Millar, Bill Seitz, Rod Slover, and John Wegman set a new record in the mile medley with a time of 3:53.6, bettering the old record of 3:56.2 set in 1971. Rod Slover also set two records this year in the Bi-County Conference meet on May 7, with a time of 42.9 seconds in the 330 yard low hurdles, and a distance of 39' 11" in the triple jump. He also broke the long jump record in the Roseville Relays with a leap of 21' 11-1/2". On May 24, at Charleston, Rod jumped 21' 9" to place 10th in the State of Illinois.


