**GRAND CIVIC AND MILITARY PROCESSION**  
In Philadelphia, February 22d, 1832, being the 100th Anniversary  
**GEORGE WASHINGTON**  
The Soldier and Statesman—the Brave and

The day was fixed on on Wednesday morning with salvo's of cannon from the Arsenal to the city. At 11 A.M. two salutes of 100 guns were discharged; and at a very early hour the movement through the different streets of citizens and strangers of every age and both sexes gave notice of the full determination of all to share in, or witness the ceremonies prescribed for the occasion. Every circumstance of the weather was favorable to the expected festivity, had been taken by the proper authorities to remove as far as possible all hindrance to the procession, through which the procession was to pass.

The public and private boats in the river were decorated with flags, ensigns and streamers, and they were all brightly lightened from their masts in the morning sun. The public buildings in the city and suburbs, as well as many private ones, displayed flags upon the occasion, which was a sight to be long remembered.

From the different Trades, Fire Companies, and Military Corps, were to be seen, in their respective places of rendezvous—and the busy movement of business on the streets of the day, and the different insignia of their craft and their official rank, was most interesting and enlivening, while cheerful activity beamed in every face, and sweetened the homogeneity of every step. When the different companies had been repeatedly ordered, they were marshalled into Third street, to take their station in the line according to regulations—but as it was impossible that such immense numbers with 1, he should pass, to be formed into line, those that were not to be first in the order, were called into Pine, Spruce, Walnut, Chestnut, Arch streets, &c. and then marshalled into the serial line as they were required. A peculiar situation was opened by the passing of the procession.

The streets of London, which the procession was to pass were crowded at an early hour—a side walk and carriage ways were filled with gazing pedestrians, who took occasional glimpses with the most good nature, as if sure that in such a dense mass, the shock which he received would of necessity be conveyed to another.

Union High School girl's track team started practicing on March 22, 1976 with nineteen girls reporting including six returning letterwomen; Connie Meloan, Pat Olson, Mary Stewart, Susan Anderson, April Steele, and Sara Delabar. The other team members included mostly freshmen.

With having only four weeks of practice and conditioning, on April 9, the female tracksters traveled to Media to battle against a tough Southern team. Union did very well at that meet beating Southern 70-41.

The next meet with Roseville on April 21 had to be postponed because of rain. This meant that Union's girlstrack team next meet would be the Bi-County held at Northwestern. Having had only one meet prior to the Bi-County and then competing in 30° weather was unfortunate for Union. Union captured 11 individual places but could only place 6th in team competition. Connie Meloan placed in all four of her events with a third in the long jump, third in the 80 yard low hurdles, fourth in the 110 yard low hurdles and fourth in the 440 yard relay. Marjorie Jake, a freshman, did surprisingly well by placing third in the mile run.

At the district meet held at Carthage, many of the school records were broken for the girls. New records are as follows:

Although Connie Meloan's long jump did not set a new school record, she received the only medal for Union at the district.

The Union girl's team managed to accumulate a total of 332 points in the six meets. The top scorers included Connie Meloan 62 3/4, Sara Delabar 43 3/4, Susan Anderson 26 1/4, Pat Olson 26, and Lesa Booten 22 1/2.

While not scoring as many points, the remaining members of the girl's team all helped to make the season a good one. Also the team really appreciated the efficiency of the managers Janet Russell and Debbie Gray, and the accuracy of statistician Nancy Kruse.
