The junior varsity squad played nine regular season games, winning 1 and losing 8.

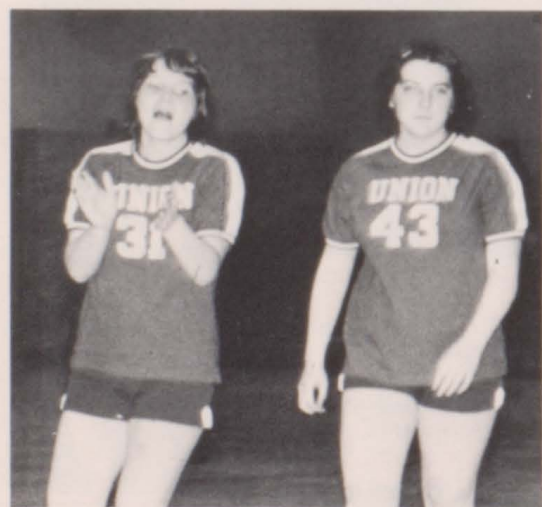

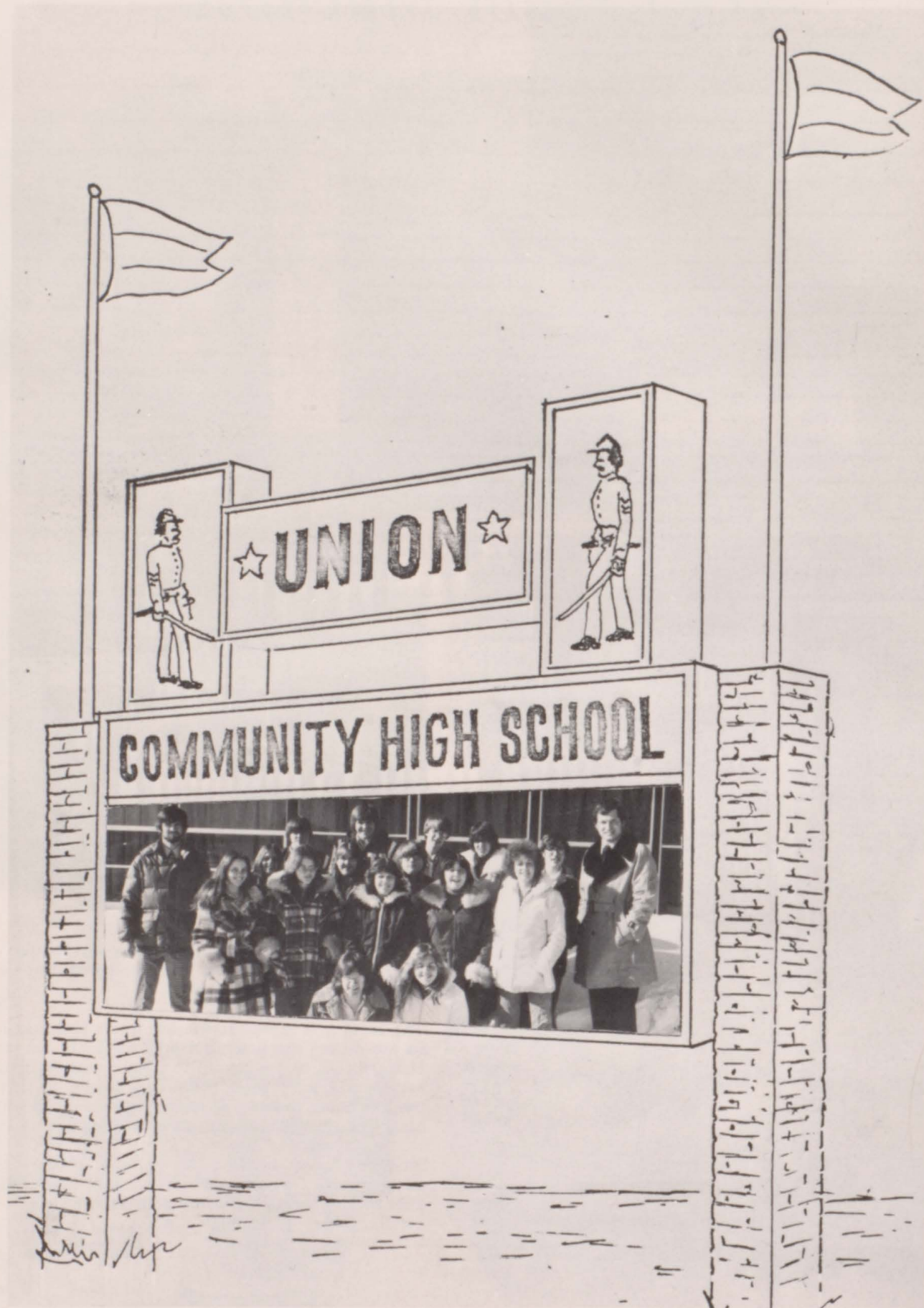
Student council embarked on a new service to U.H.S. students this year with the purchase of a soft serve ice cream machine.

Union High School Student Council purchased a lighted, outdoor marquee, which cost approximately \$4,000.

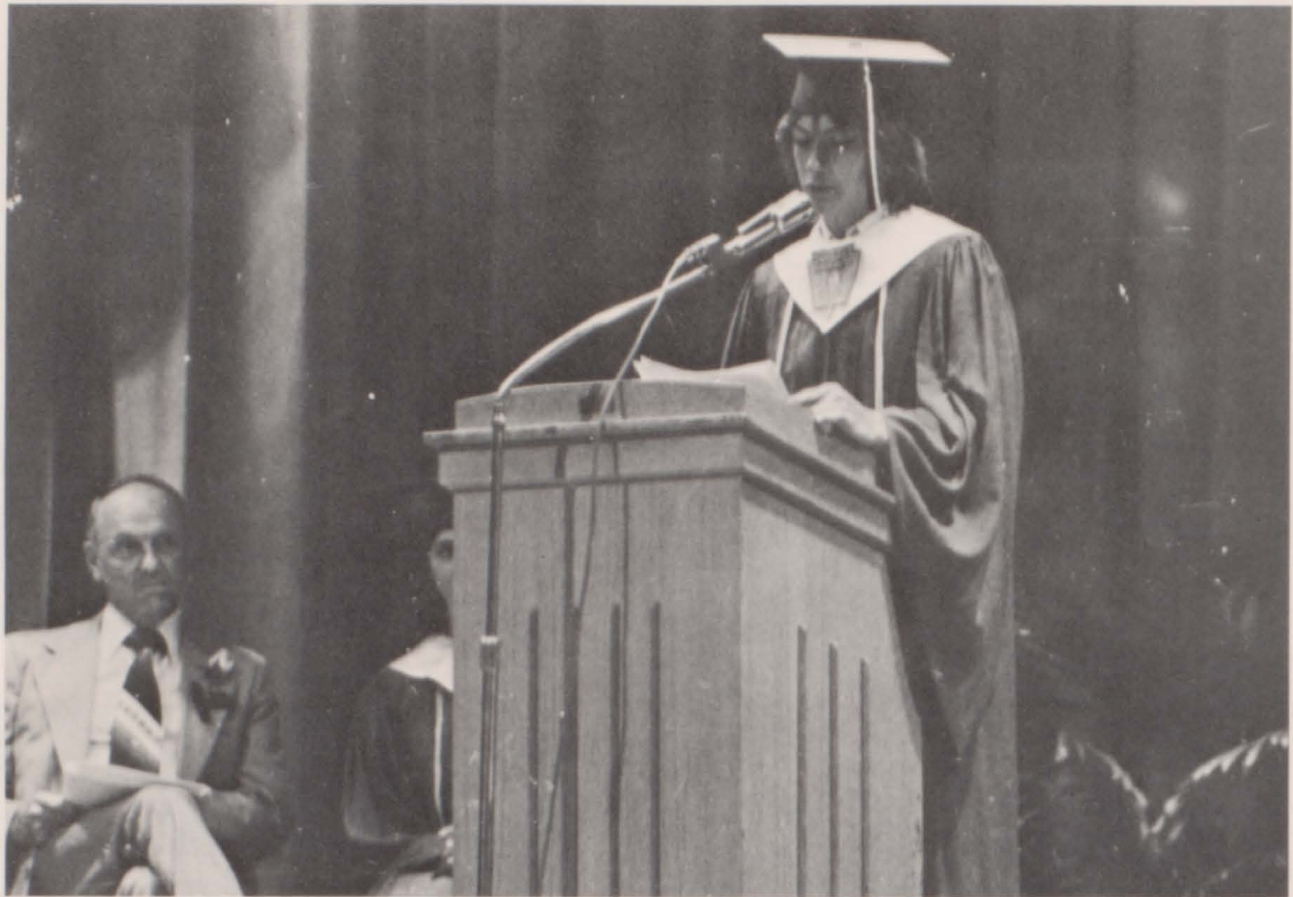

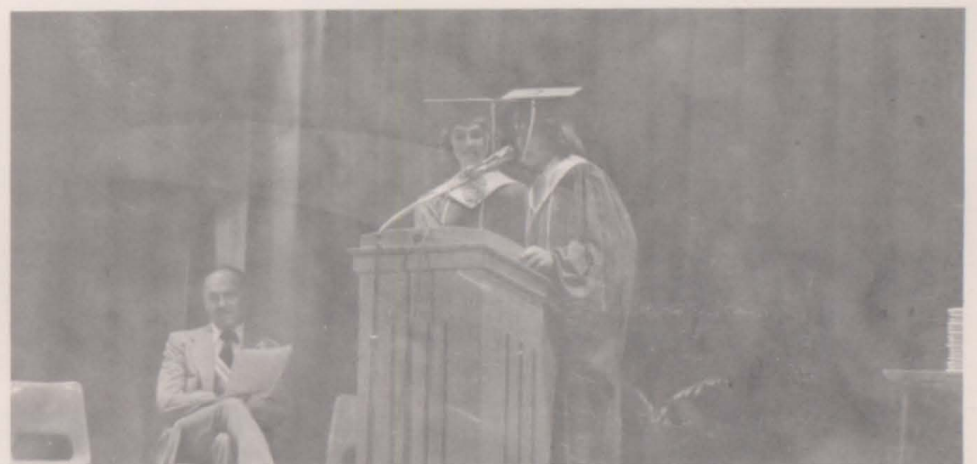
