In so doing, the 440 relay team set a new school record for Union with a time of 45.7 seconds. Jake was also thanked for his assistance as starter at all home meets), in making the new Union 400 meter Track a reality, Coach L. Sterett awarded letters to fresh. D. Oaks, sophomores T. Cook, C. Dunn, B. Sterett, M. Gall, T. Gray, B. Lindo, and J. Johnson, (soph. S. Eaton received a Yankees back patch), Jr.'s S. Martin, T. Bielser, and D. Perry, and Sr.'s R. Eckley, R. Ferguson, K. Millizer, J. Johnson, and J. Smith. L. McGriff was awarded a letter as the thinclad's manager. Miss T. Sterett, served as the squads manager for two years, and for four years as statistician, was awarded her fourth consecutive letter, a bouquet of roses, and a small pin.

The final presentation by Coach Sterett was the High Scorer Award to J. Johnson. In addition, small plaques will be awarded to the members of the record-setting relay teams.

Following the track awards, J. Johnson, on behalf of the Yankee thinclads, presented Coach Sterett with a card of thanks and a gift certificate.
