## Unit 115 Board Of Education

The Union Community District \#115 Board of Education is a duly-elected, Public board consisting of seven member nominated and elected by qualified voters of the district, for a period of three years, or as prescribed by state law.
The board has the primary function of developing policies which govern the operation of the district. They have authority and power only while in session and acting formally as members of the board, or when acting as a committee appointed or elected by the board.
The direct administration of the district is delegated to Superintendent Wegman, who acts as executive officer of the Board. The superintendent is directly responsible to the board for the execution of the district's policies rules and regulations, and other duties directly assigned to him by the board.

do you consider your greatest achievement for the student body?
As I reflect on the past four years, perhaps the greatest contribution I have made to UHS has been spending time and energy organizing and monitoring a good, sound educational program and environment. This program and environment can be demonstrated by some of the changes during these years: handbooks for the student body and faculty, course descriptions, reactivated student council, computer-assisted scheduling and grade reporting, textbook and departmental budgets, student temporary files and other recordkeeping updates, new equipment for the band and audio-visual, the marquee, and improvements in the lighting system, track, welding and automotive shops and two new classrooms and the list goes on.
Do you think the attitude and atmospher at Union contribute to a good, educational setting?
Perhaps the greatest noticeable change has been in the students' attitude. Knowing the faculty and I care about them and are proud of them has changed uncertainty into a productive student body. During these growing years I have attempted to maintain a policy of being consistent, fair, firm and friendly with every student at Union High School.
What would you like to see happen for the students in the next few years?
Unfortunately, most of what I think the student body needs to make a well-rounded education costs money. The physical facilties must be improved. We have space and interest in tennis courts, a universal gym , outdoor basketball court, softball backstop, visitor bleachers, concession stand with restroom, additional parking, enclosed storage for equipment and materials, and an enclosed walkway to the shops. I would like to see a wider range of subjects for the academically able students and classes for our exceptional, gifted students.
Before you became a principal, did you teach in a classroom situation?
I started my educational career by teaching all high school math classes in a small community in Missouri. I moved to Hamilton, Ill, and taught 7th and 8th grade math for two years and high school algebra for three. Before coming to Union, I served as principal at Dallas City High School for two years.
Union has so many extra-curricular activities that you attend, do you participate in the community?
Although I am quite interested in community activities, I have found that I have little time available with all the high school's events. I am a member of the Monmouth United Methodist Church, YMCA and the Prime Beef Festival Committee. I served one year as chairman of the parade committee and two years as a member. I find a great satisfaction in my work with the students and faculty at Union. Perhaps my greatest reward or recognition was the honor of being named the "'1978 Educational Administrator of the Year. "

Union's season started off on a weak foot by losing to Carthage at home, not only did we lose the game, but we also dropped our next 2 games due to a great deal of injuries, which caused poor play.

After our first 3 games, we got our act together to even the season at 3 wins and 3 loses. This was the first time since 1970 that a Union team has won 3 games in a row.

The last $1 / 3$ of our season was not so fortunate. As we ran into a very physical team at Northwestern, and dropped a heart breaker to Roseville in the closing seconds. After the two games, it became very difficult to prepare for the upcoming Southern game. To some people's surprise, Union was ready, our offense was scoring, but our defense could not contain the powerful state class 1A semifinalist, falling 22-48. To our surprise, we were the only team in the Bi-County to score that many points on Southern.

Our overall record was a dismal 3-6, and finishing at 5th place in the conference. Although our record may not be anything to be proud of, there are of course, some individual records and team records set for this season, that deserve some recogination.

As a team, we finished 10th in the state in class 1A schools for Total Offense. Some of the other records that fell this year were first downs for a season 111, Passing Offense 371 yards, Rushing Offense 1661 yards, Scoring Offense 154 points, Blocked Kicks in a Season 4.

We also had several individual records for the past season, one which stands out the most is Kirk Lewis' 1078 yard rushing performance. This was a first even for a Union athlete. Kirk finished 3rd in rushing and 5 th in scoring among Class 1 A schools.

David Tee also had a fine season with 38 career pass receptions and a season record of 11 quarterback sacks. Both David and Kirk earned All-Conference Honors.

Scott Cooper has a record of his own, one which will stand for some time to come, an 88 run from scrimmage scoring a TD.

Like I said, "we may not have won very many games, but I felt we made them exciting to watch. " I want to wish the best of luck to these young men, on Unions' Football Team, for their future.
