The Union boys thinclads ended a successful 1980 season with 22 members, of which 14 members earned enough points to letter in addition to meeting the other requirements. Two new school records were set: Cliff Dunn broke the high jump record with a jump of 6 feet 1 inch ( 1.8542 meters), breaking the record of Steve Wegman set in 1971 of 6 feet, while Marty Gall set a new pole vault record of 13 feet (3.9624), breaking the record of 12 feet 6 inches set by Rob Eckley in 1978. The boys first meet was the W.I.U. Invitational, in which Terry Cook, Marty Gall, Cliff Dunn, Jeff Johnson, Brian Lindo, and Brad Sterett participated, and Marty placed fifth in the pole vault. The final meet of the season was the Ft. Madison Relays, held on May 20, 1980, and in between were 13 other meets, including dual meets, a triangular, and a number of Relays, in addition to the Conference Meet.

Four of the squad members - Marty Gall, Jeff Johnson, Brian Lindo, and Brad Sterett - had been out for track all four years, and completed their final season; one of these young men - Brian Lindo - had lettered all four years. The other three had lettered for three years, as did Terry Cook, and Cliff Dunn, each of whom had been out for three years.

Since the boys track season was not over when the Annual Awards Banquet was held, letters were awárded at an Awards Day held at Union High School on May 21, 1980. Those receiving letters included freshmen Steve Bielser, George Olson, and Darren Tee, sophomores Brad Lindo and Jim McClintic, juniors Joel Johnson and Jon McGraw, and seniors Terry Cook, Cliff Dunn, Jeff Johnson, Brian Lindo, Brad Sterett, and Russell Torrance, plus Sarah Prater as Statistician. In addition, sophomore Shane Lewis received a patch.

Highlights of the 1980 season included Cliff Dunn winning the Class C High Hurdles at the Keokuk Relays, Marty Gall winning the Pole Vault at the Carthage Relays and setting a new school record, and later winning the same event at the Aledo Invitational tieing the meet record, and again at Bi-Country Conference Meet held at Union, Cliff Dunn winning the Triple Jump at the BiCountry Conference Meet and the High Jump at the Aledo Invitational, the freshman relay team of Steve Bielser, Brian Getting, Troy Simpson, and Darren Tee placing second in both the 440 and 880 Freshman Relays at the Roseville Relays. Naturally there were other highlights, such as edging out Yorkwood in a dual meet by 71 to 70 , for the second year in a row and beating Warren 85 to 60.1980 was a good season for the Yankee boys thinclads.
