


Varsity Goes Down Fighting





Although the yankees didn't have a record winning season, they enjoyed each moment, were determined, and will anticipate the '87 football season.



J.V.'s Share Bi-County Honor




The Lady Yanks ended the season with a 9-7 record overall. The girls had a great season and should continue to have winning seasons if they keep playing as good as they are capable of.


















Varsity Has Successful Season





With only two team members leaving, and with a better interest in track, the boys track team can look forward to another great year of track at U.H.S.



Girls Have A Stellar Year








The evening was enjoyed by all present and will be a lovely memory of the 1986-87 school year.
