Varsity Goes Down Fighting

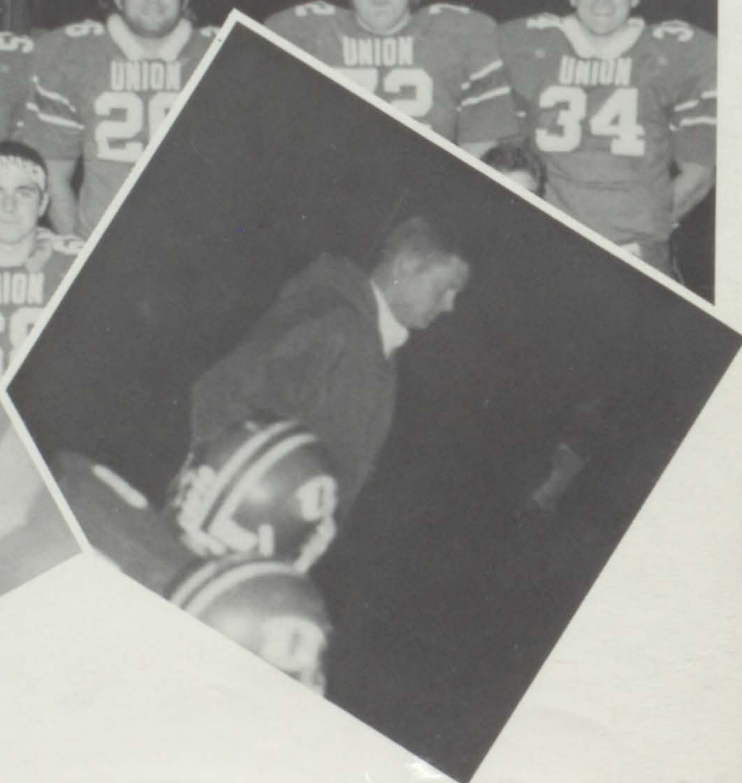
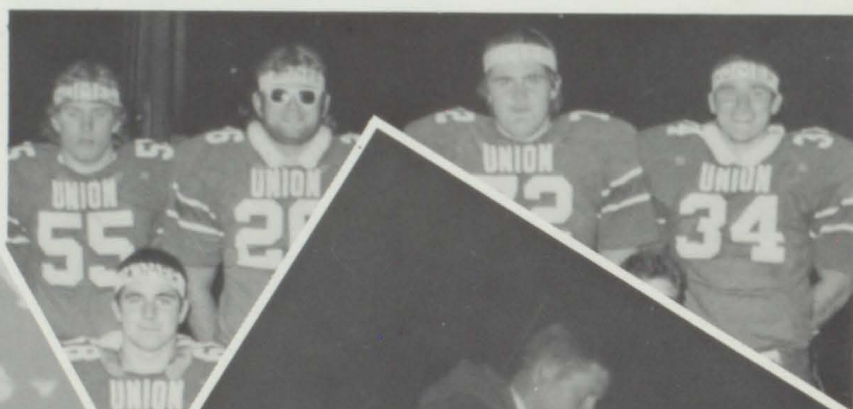
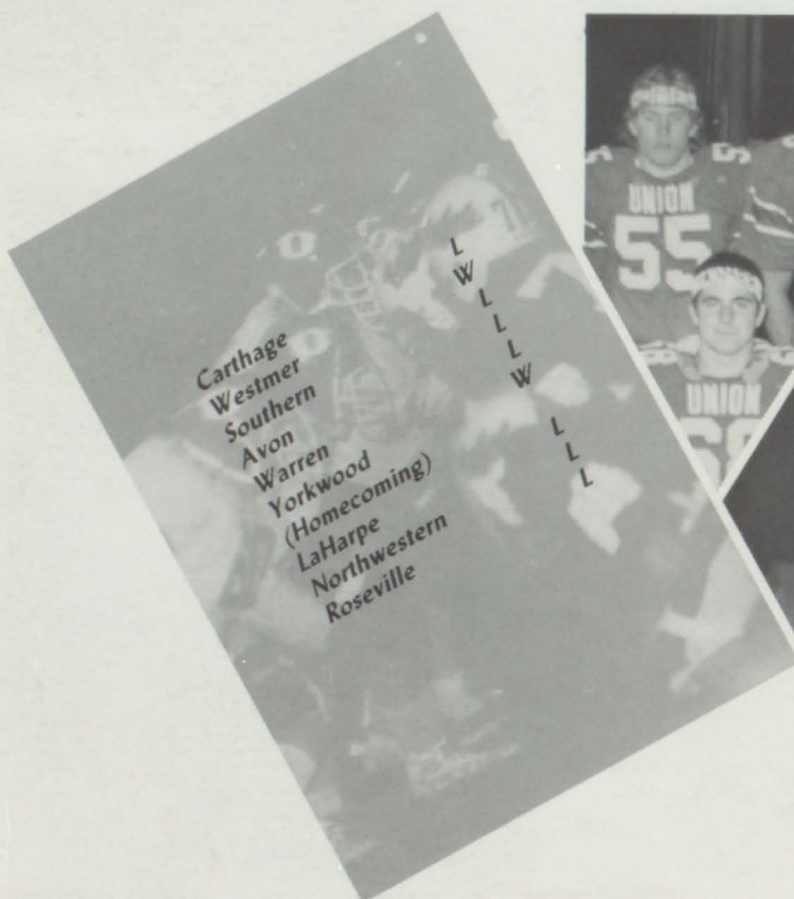

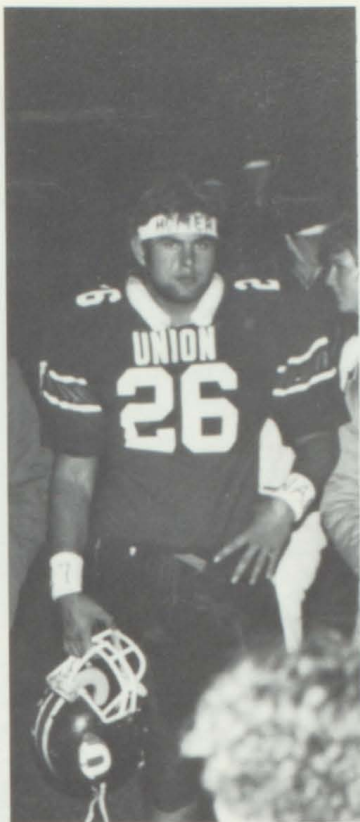

Union J.V.'s Win Conference

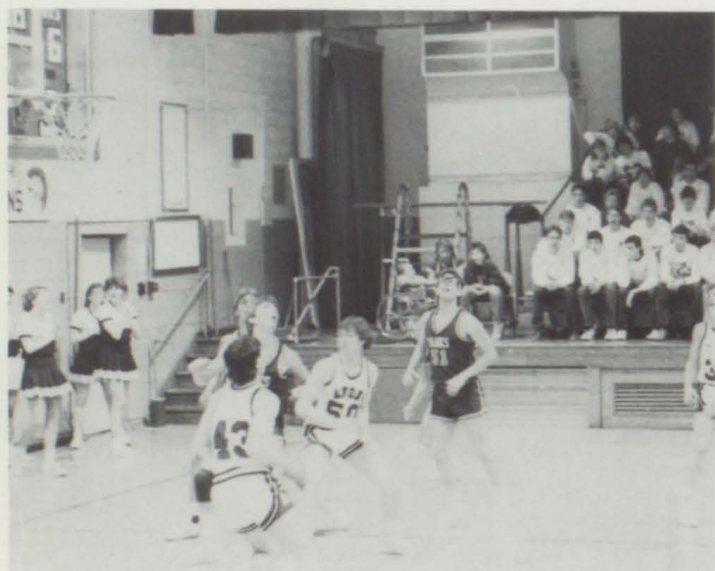

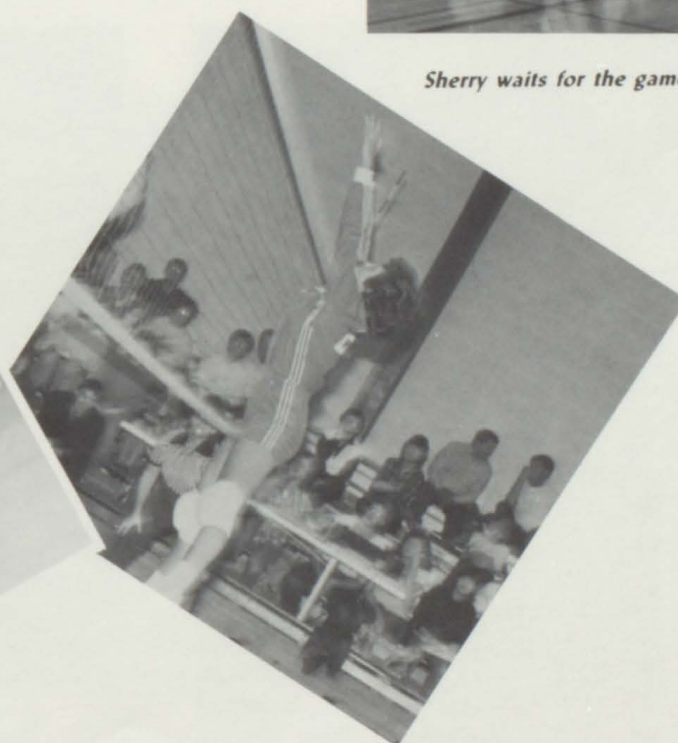

Talented J.V. Squad Spikes A Great Season

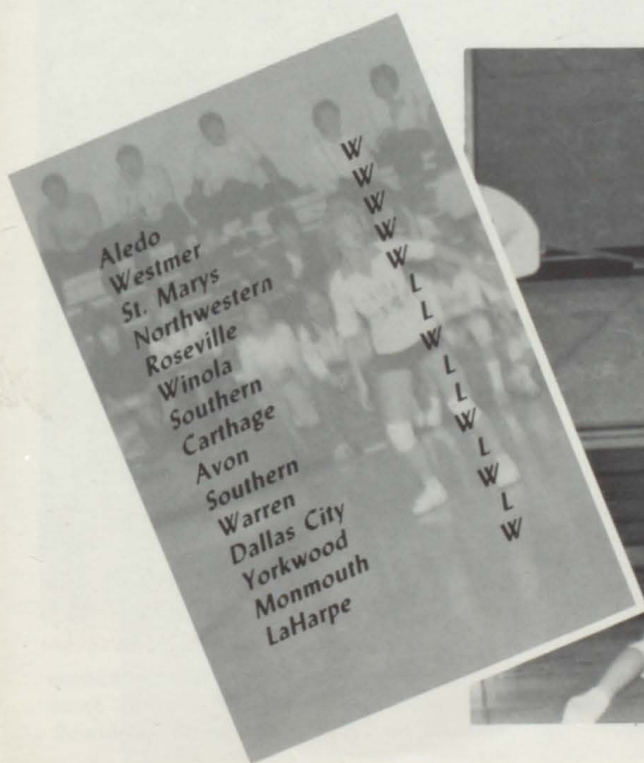

An Exceptional Year

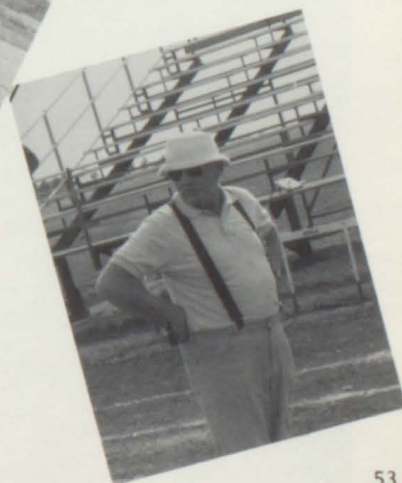

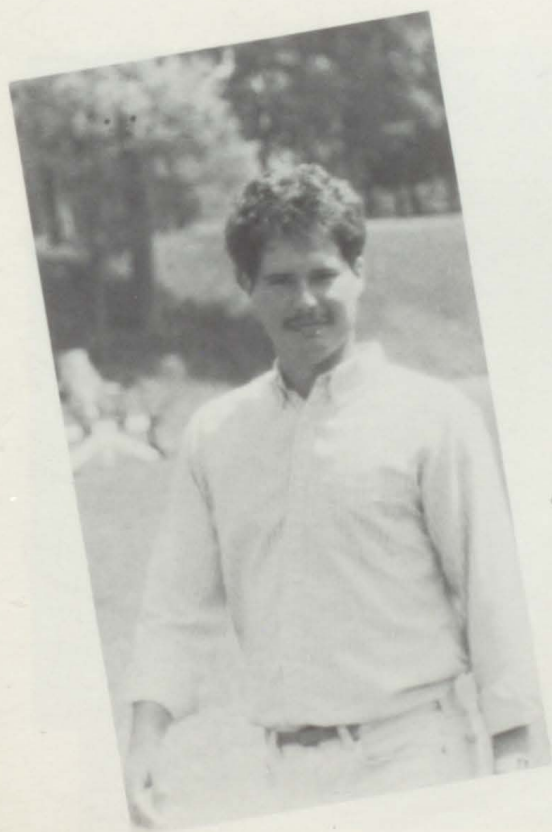

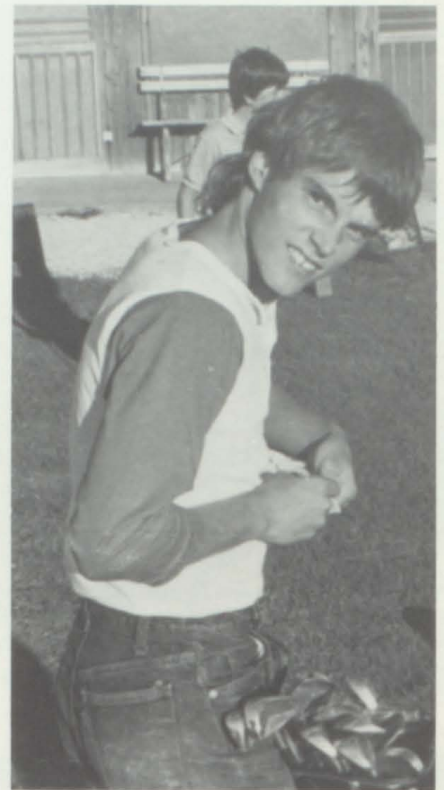


An Impressive First Year

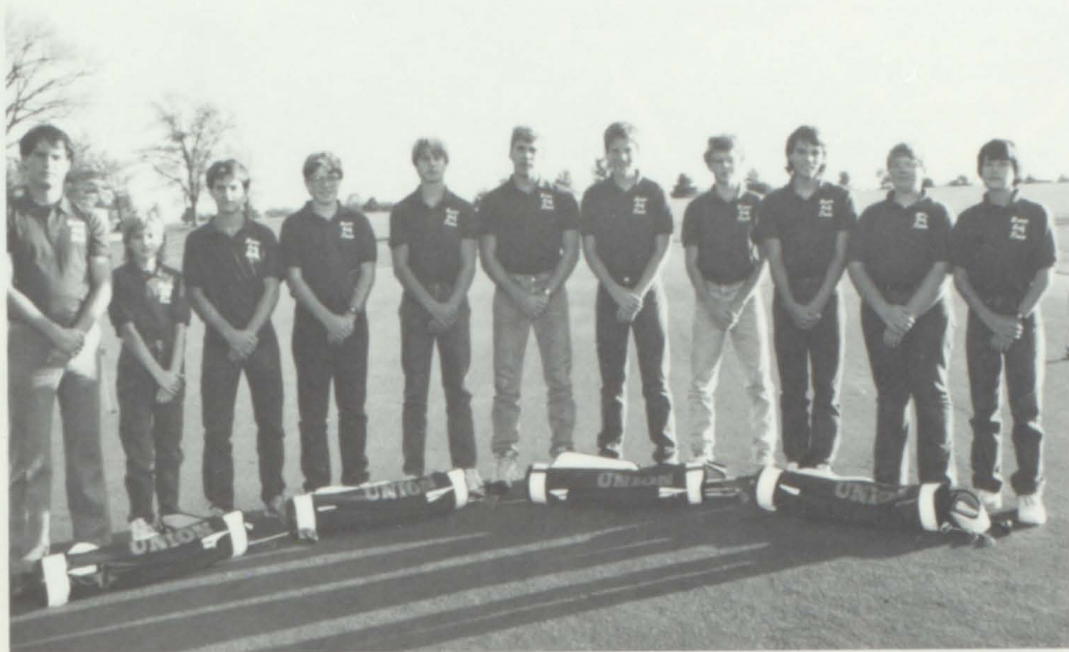

It was quite appropriate for friends and couples to be together at the Sweetheart Dance sharing the night on Valentine's Day.



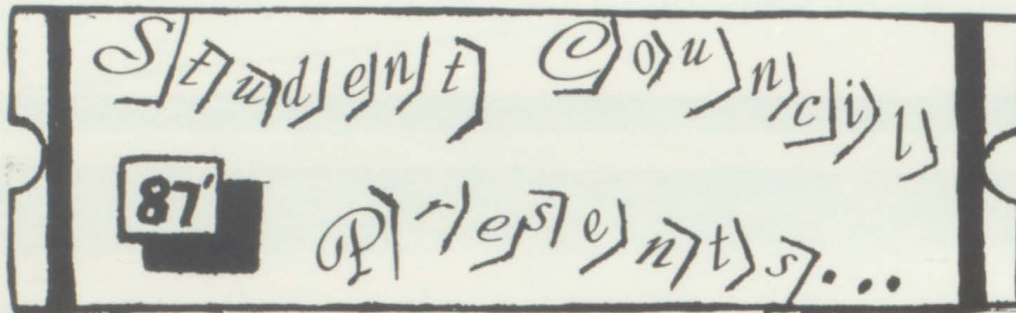
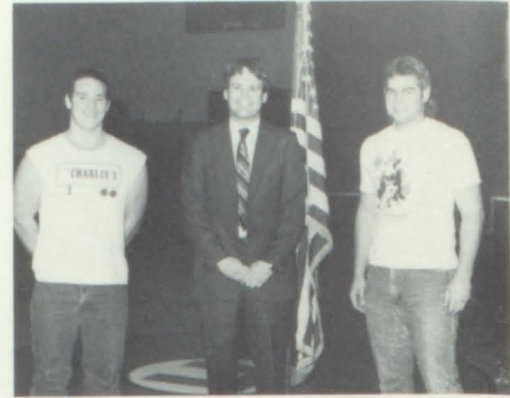
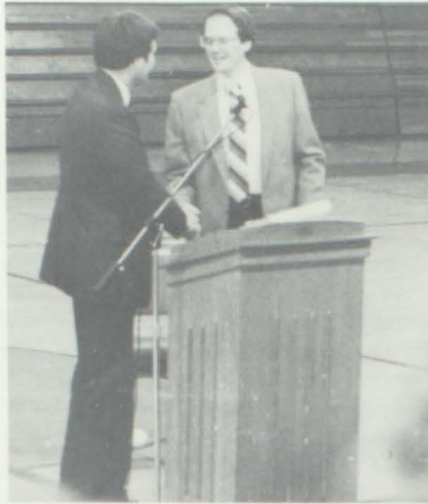

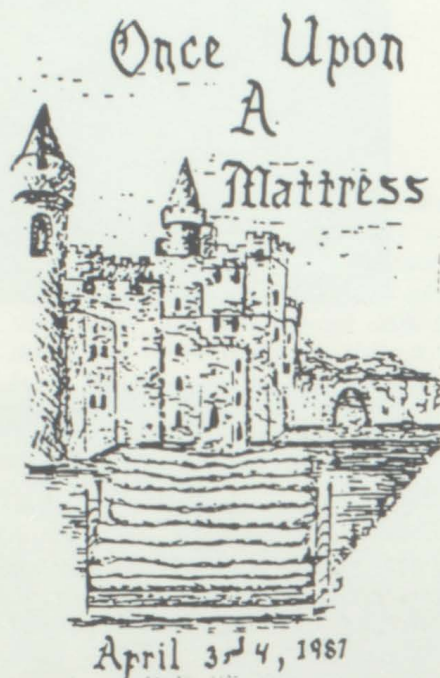
The Bi-County Art Show was held at La-Harpe High School. Judging was done Thursday evening by judges from Carthage High School and Western Illinois University.
