With lots of support from the student body, the Football Cheerleaders led a Homecoming Rally that truly showed the Football Team that "We think Union is #1!"



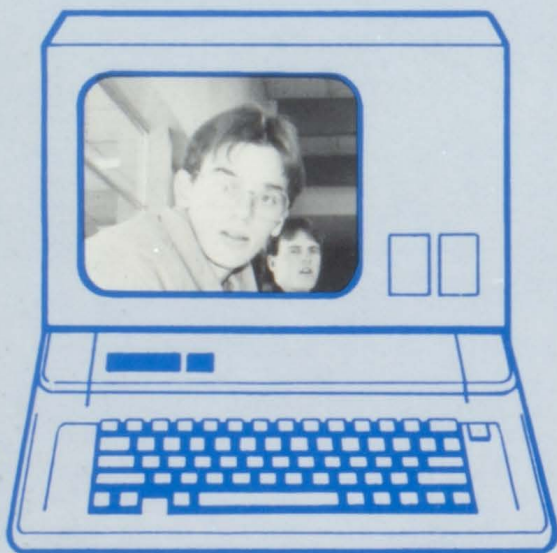
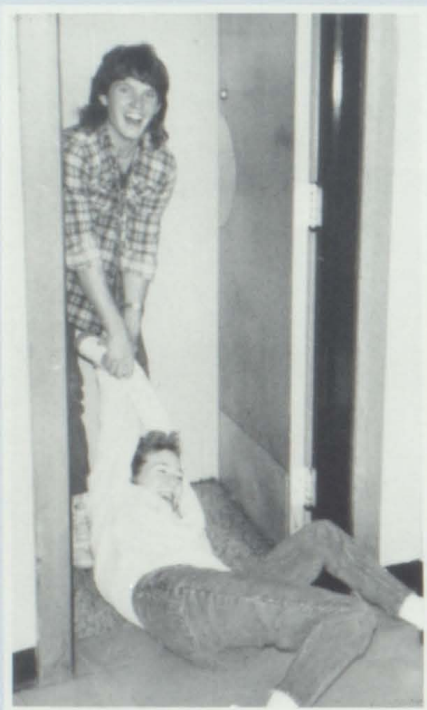

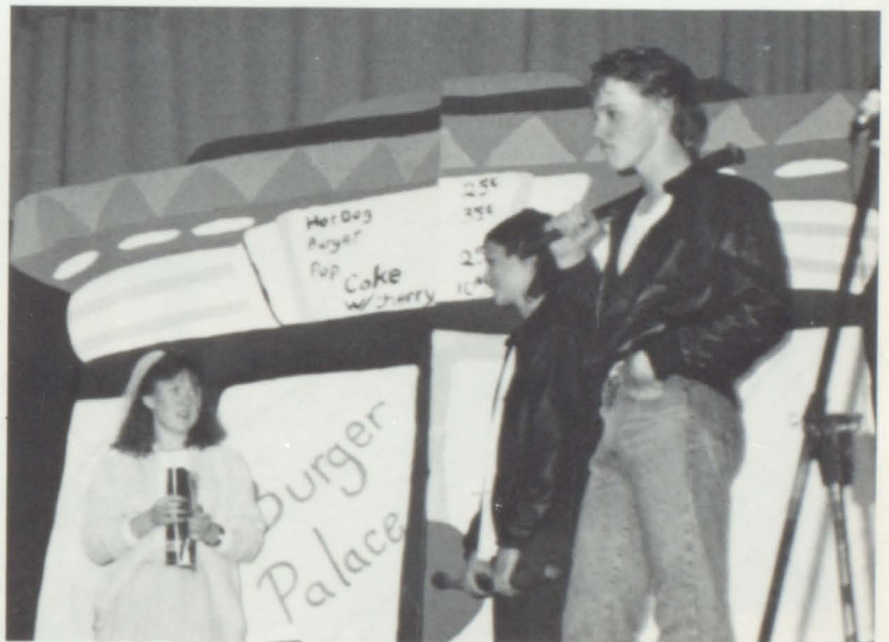
# GREASE
