
Student Council organized a fun program filled with skits, lip sinks, races, apple-dunking contests, and other fun surprises.

With lots of support from the student body, the Football Cheerleaders led a Homecoming Rally that truly showed the Football Team that "We think Union is #1!"




SLOW START BUT BIG FINISH

At the beginning of the season, they weren't quite sure how they would do but they surprised everyone and ended up in second place in the Bi-County.







TOUGH SEASON FOR JV'S



Show Choir is pleased with the year they have had and they are looking forward to a good year next year as well.








