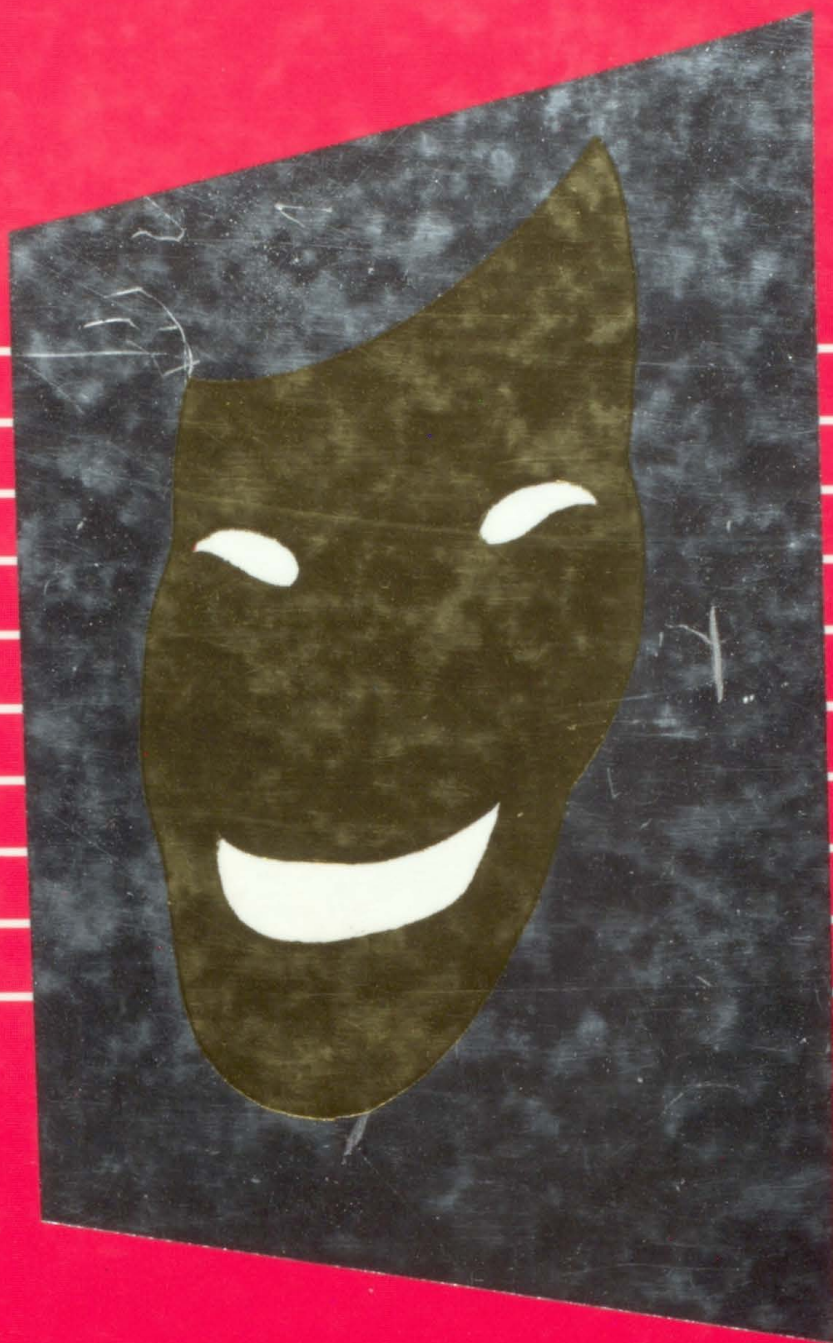

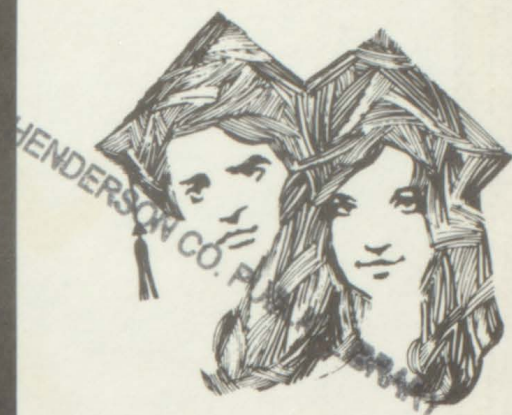

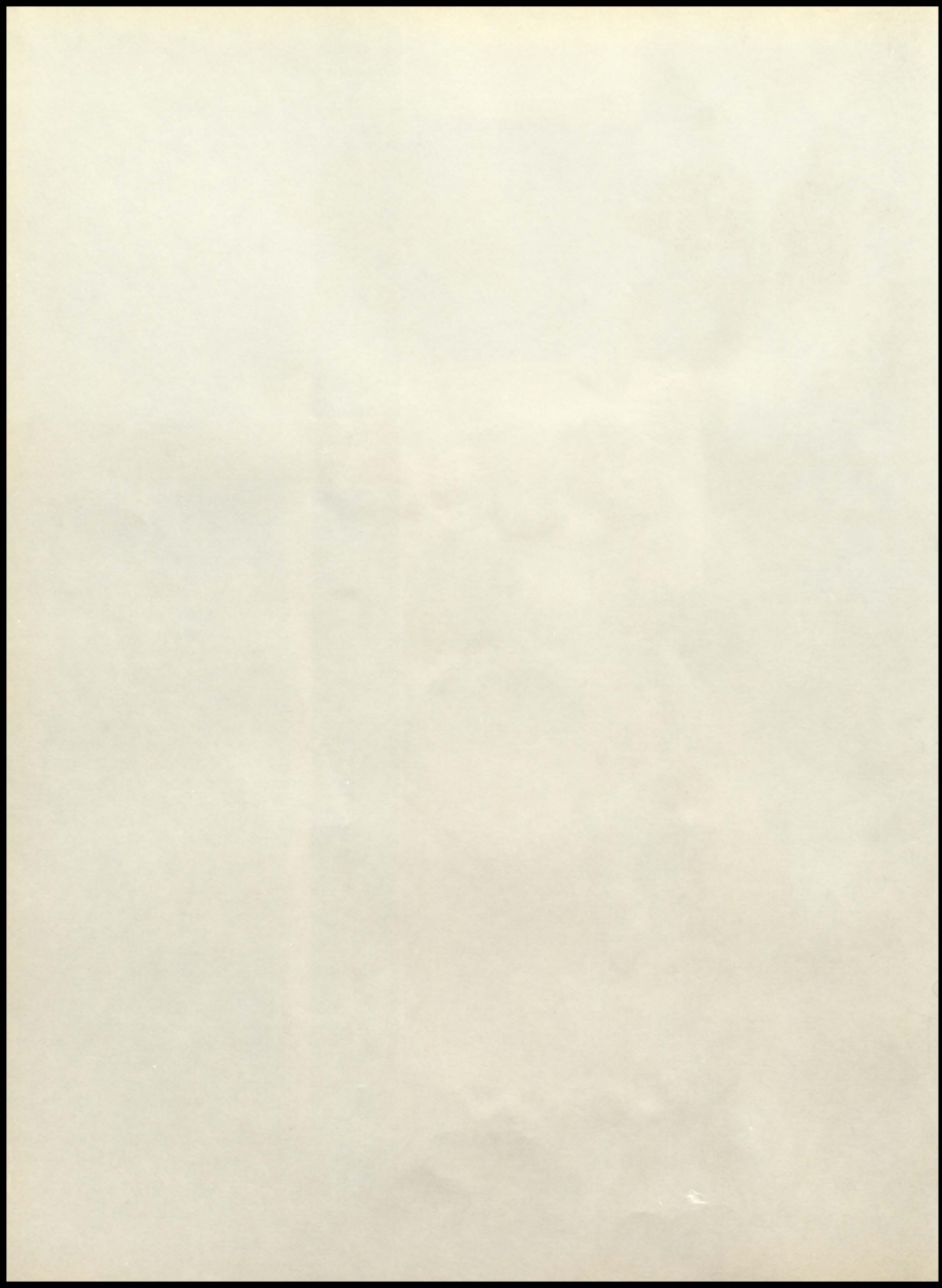
Tears of parting sadness will be shed and shouts of joy for a bright new future will resound as students say goodbye to their high school years and begin their new life.

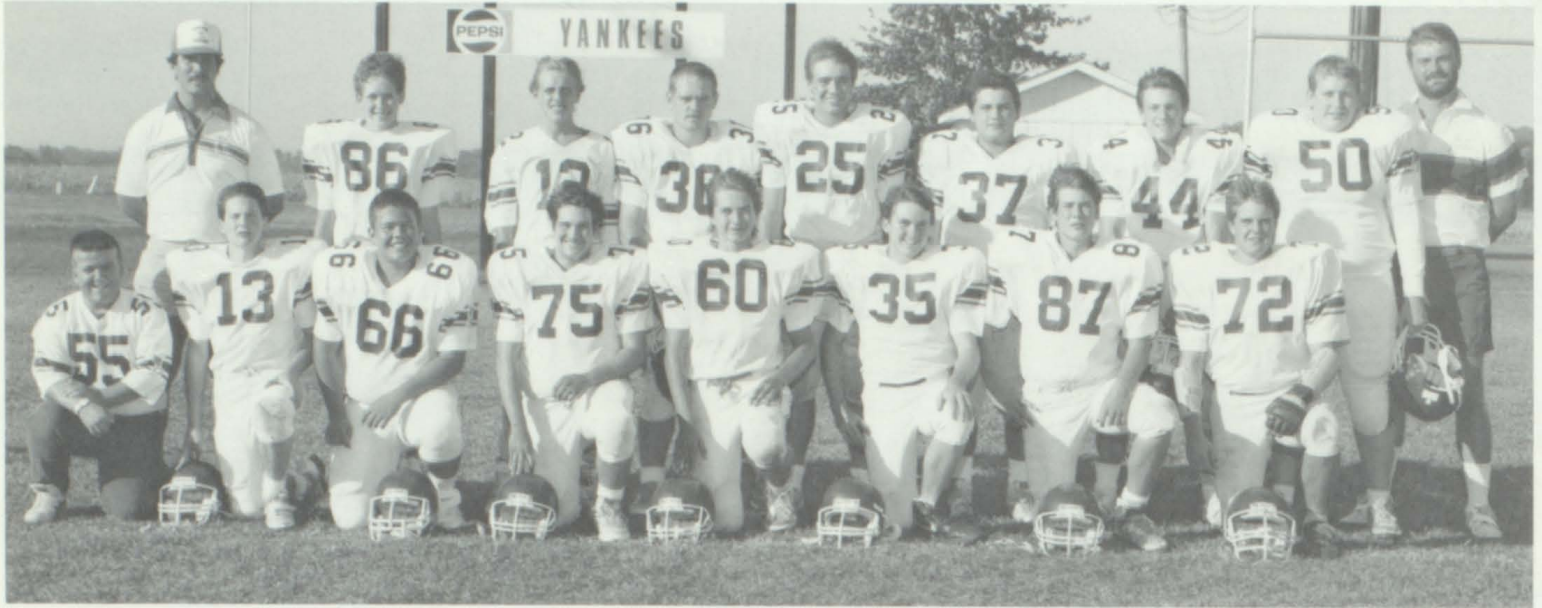

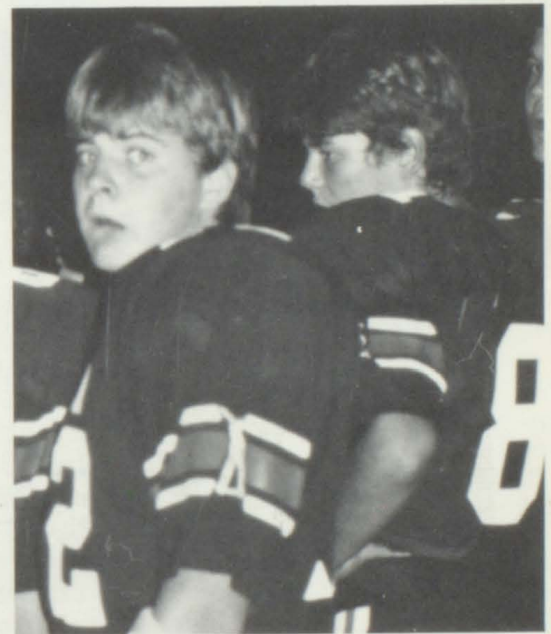

Their drive, determination and dedication were strong factors in this year's football team. We hope that these qualities will stand out in the seasons to come.

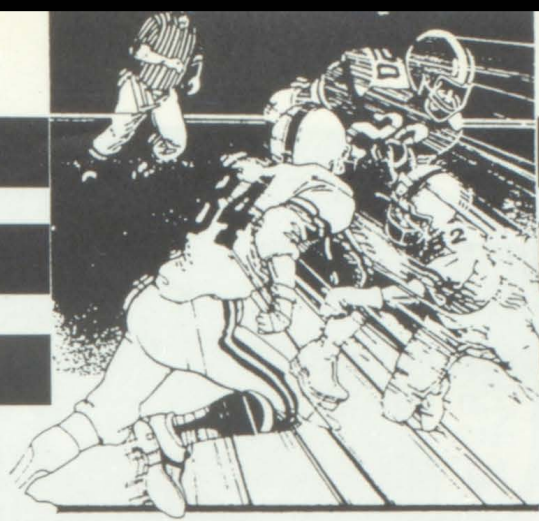

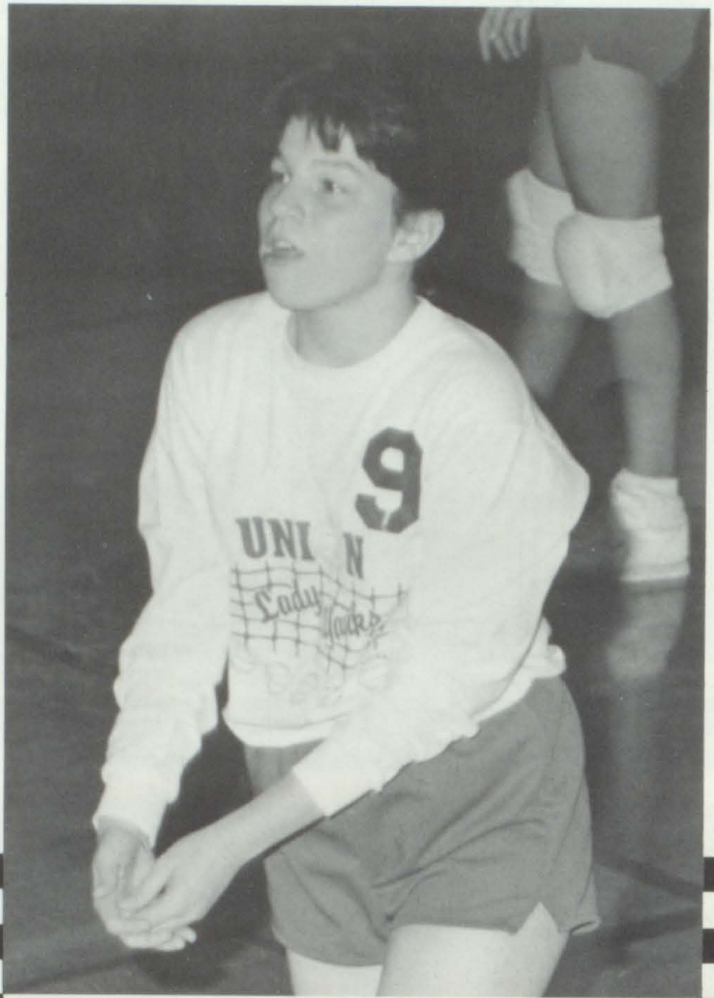

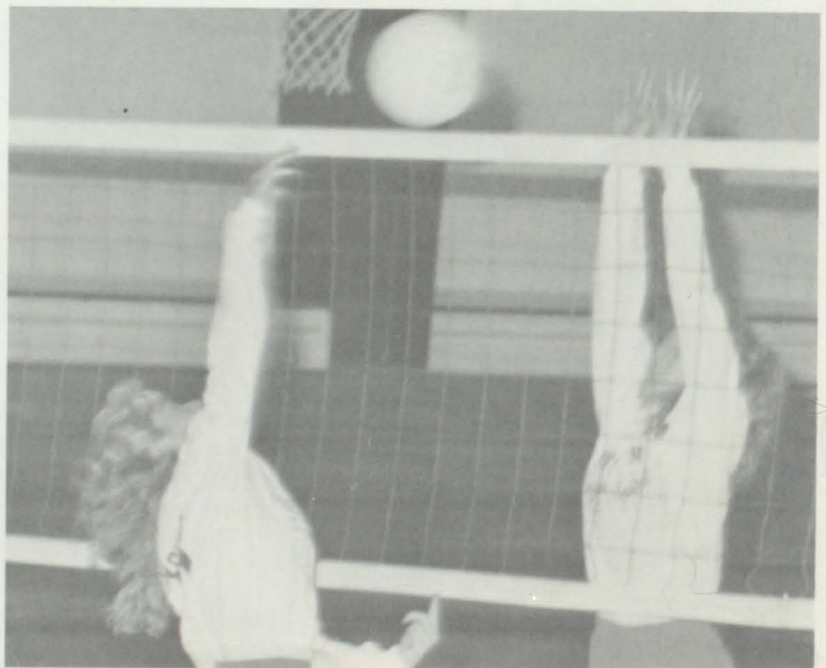

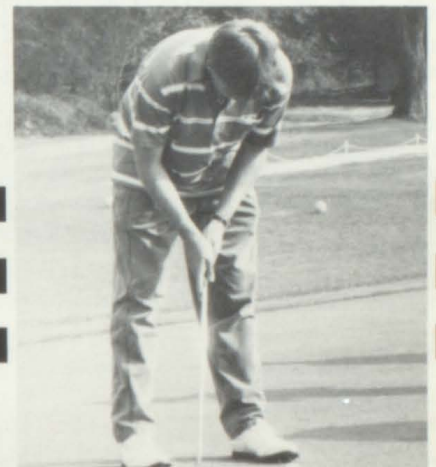

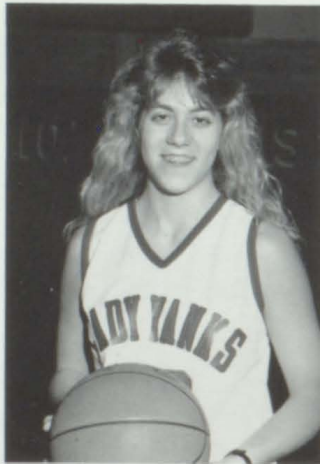

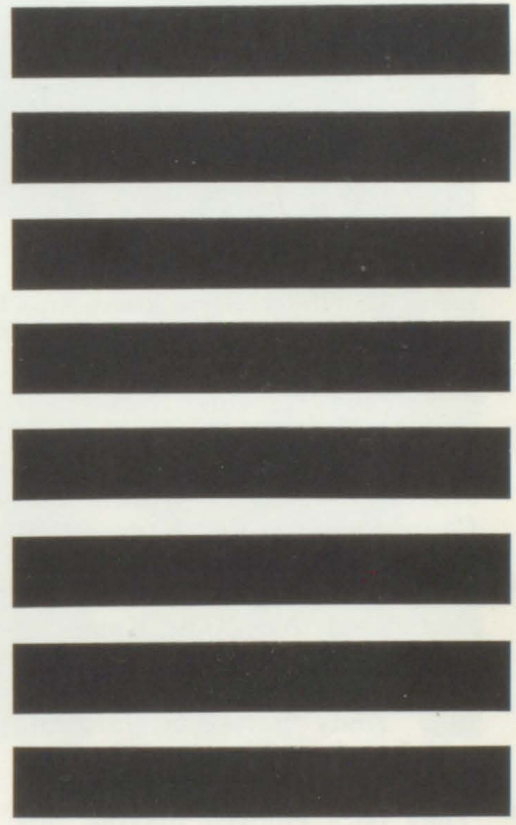

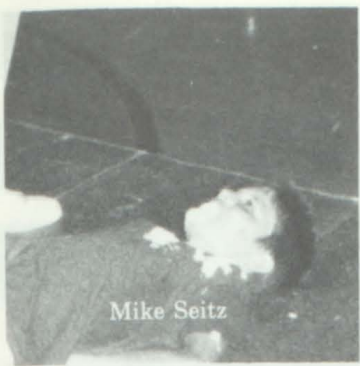
to improve the teams performance," said Andy Bertelsen.

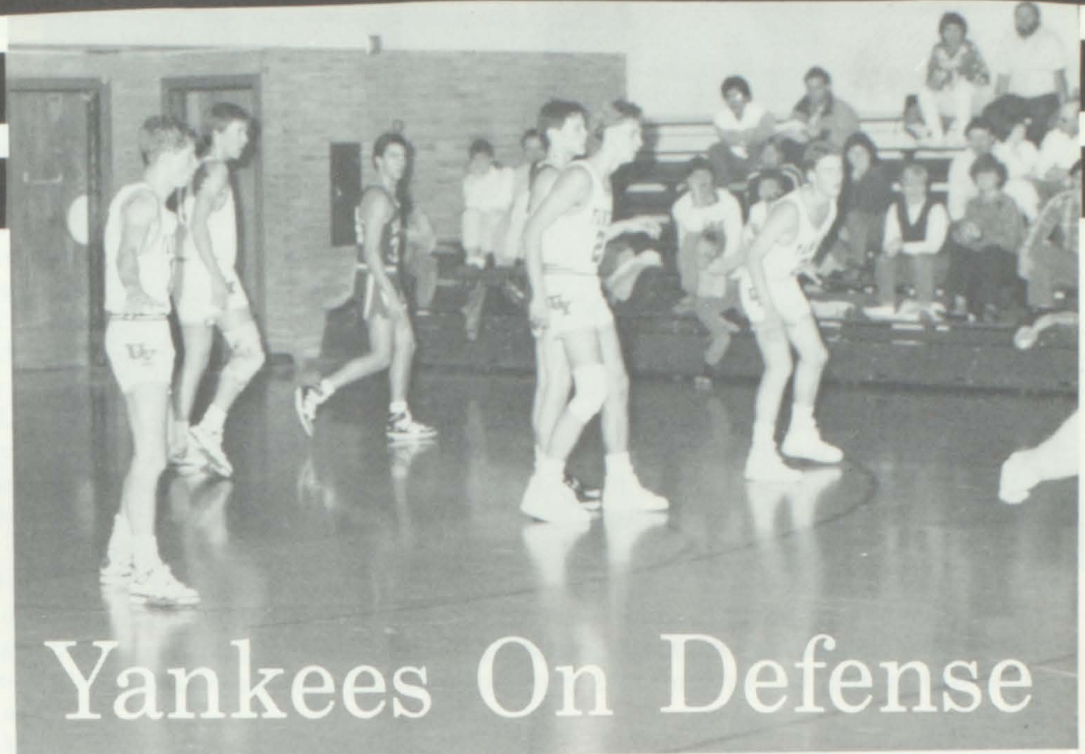

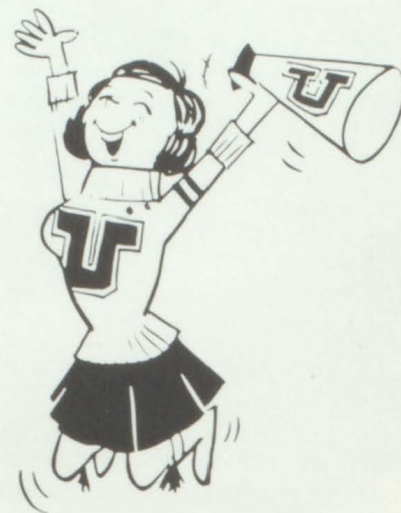

# Boys Track



Union's boys track squad for the 1990 season was the smallest in the school's history. (The average number of squad members for the past nine seasons has been seventeen.) Returning letterman included juniors Kyle Guthrie and George Link. John Newman was the lone sophomore reporting, Rodney Wright was the lone senior, and Chad Hallgren and Kyle Lewis were the other juniors; none of the six members finishing his season, other than the two returning letterman, had been out for track at Union before. It was a small squad, but one that practiced hard, and did their best during meets. In dual meets we were beaten by teams that had not beaten us in ten years, but in the larger meets we were never shut out, frequently beating teams who had beaten us in dual meets. Due to a lack of members we could only run about one relay per meet, but John Newman, Chad Hallgren, Kyle Guthrie, and George Link sold down put less than their best effort, and it generally paid off, sometimes with medals. Rodney Wright and Kyle Lewis, with no previous experience, held down the weight section, performing for the team in the shot put and discus events.

One school record was broken this season. Kyle Guthrie broke the high jump record set by Rusty Hains in 1965 at 6 feet 1½ inches. At the Bi-County Conference meet held at Monmouth College on May 1, 1990, Kyle jumped 6 feet 2 inches, and on May 8, 1990 at the Roseville Relays he jumped 6 feet 4½ inches.

Three meets were rained out this year, but two were rescheduled — Keokuk Relay and the Ft. Madison Relays. Otherwise it was a good season.

At the Athletic Banquet, Kyle Guthrie won the high scorer award, and mention was made that Kyle Guthrie, Chad Hallgren, Kyle Lewis, George Link, and John Newman would be receiving letters once the season was over, following the Ft. Madison Relays. Several people were recognized for their help during the season, including Jenny Olson, Betty Sterett, Deborah Sterett, Jim McClintic, and Jerry Shutwell, plus Carol Asterburn, and Sandy Hannam.

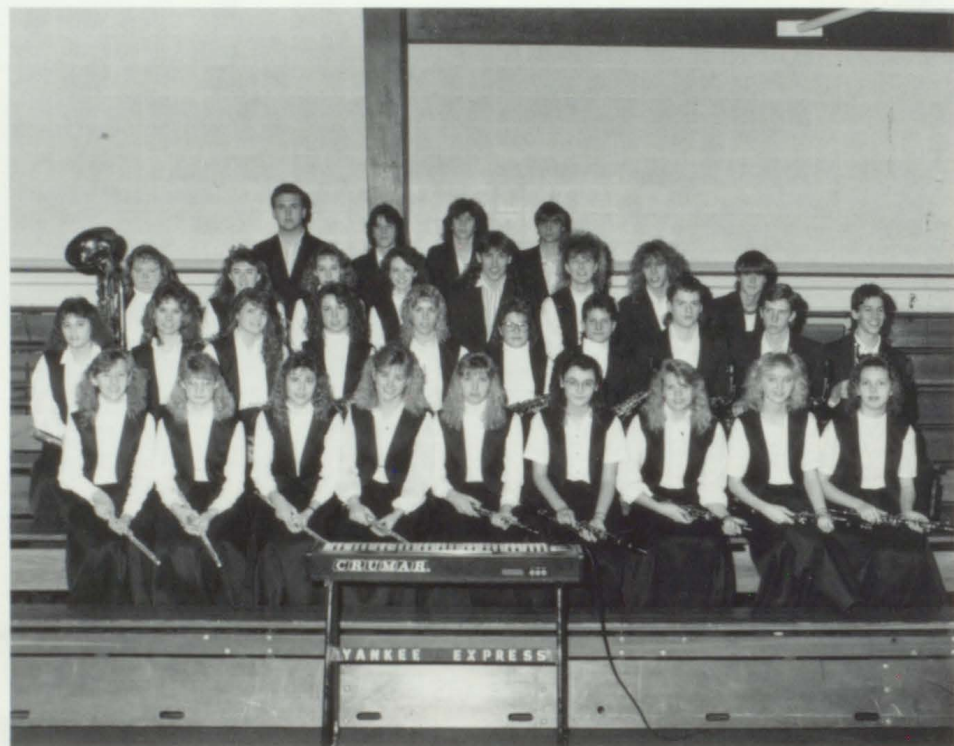

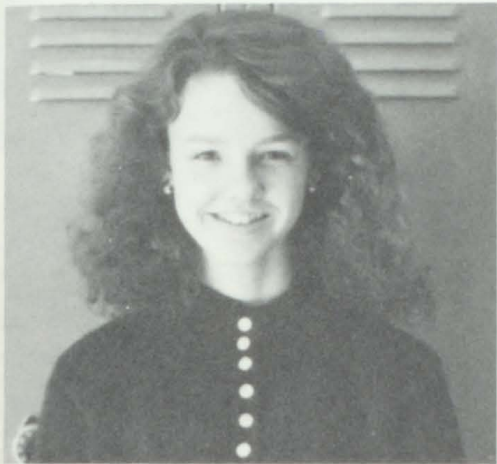

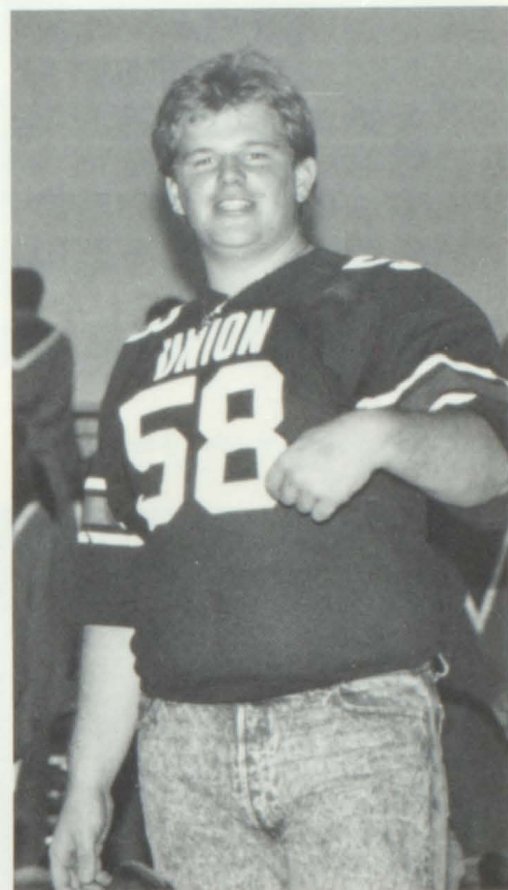
# Student Council

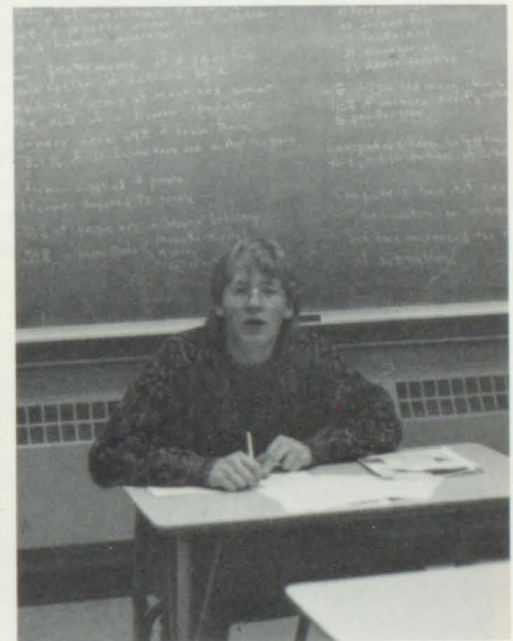

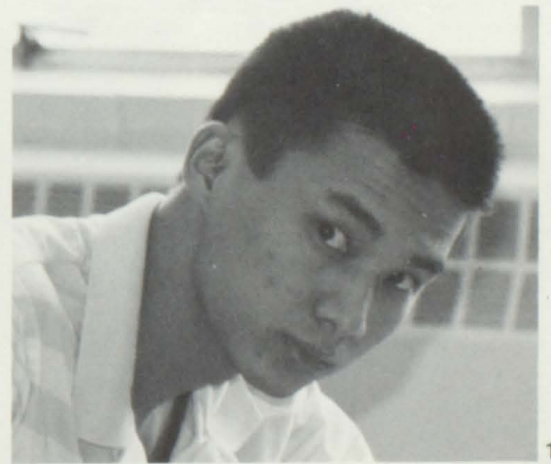
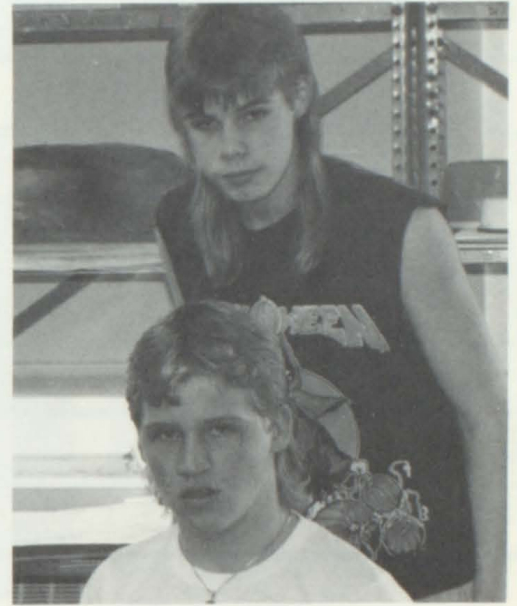


# FFA
