With our Juniors and Sophomores getting a lot of playing time, and a big group of Freshmen, we should expect good things happening for the 1995 football team.

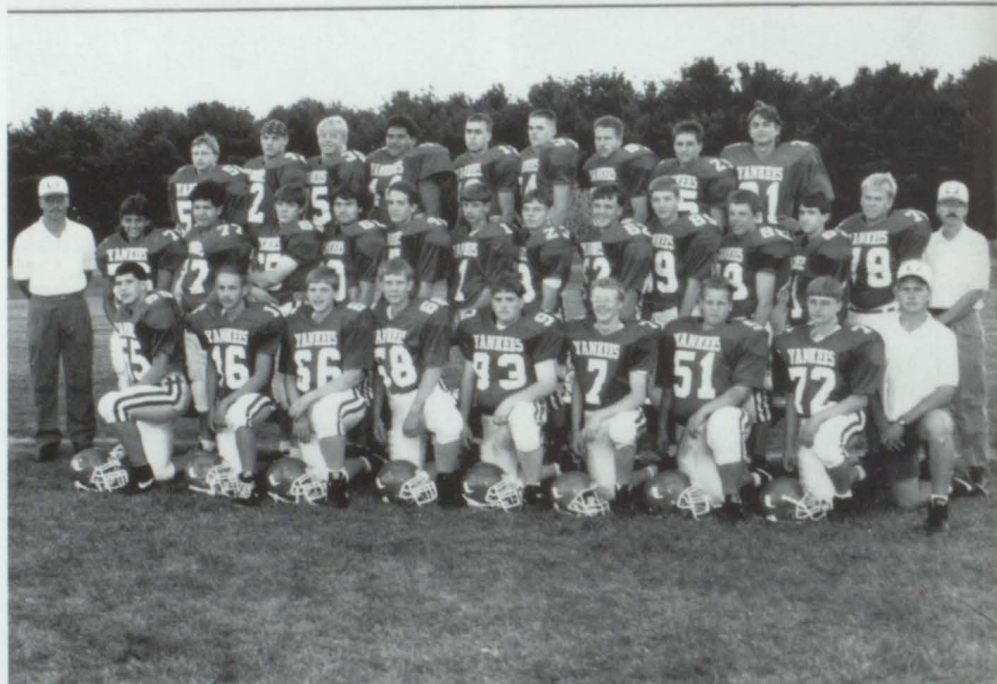

Wesley Boyer: My most memorable moments were my sophomore and senior seasons, and the post-game chat after the Alexis game my senior year.

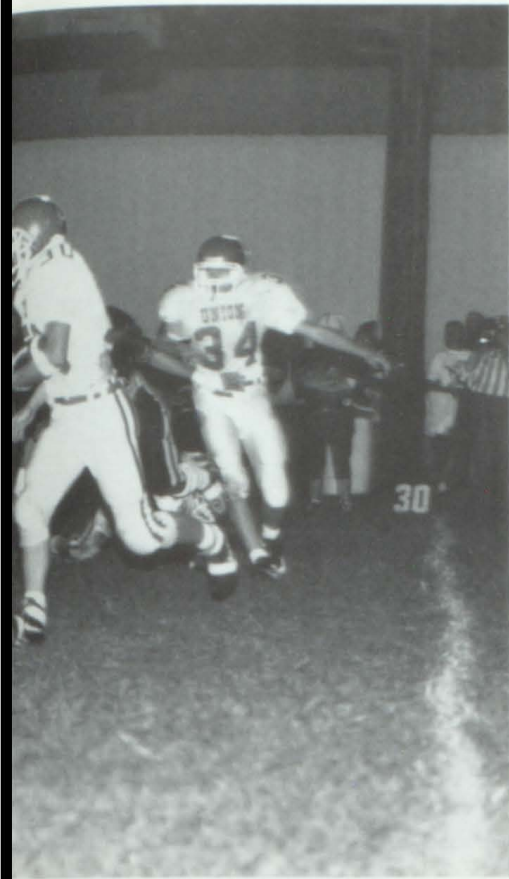

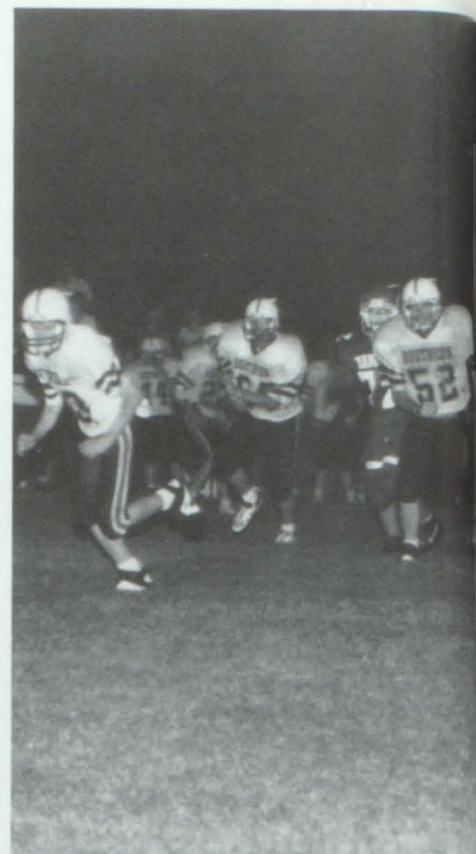
We feel that regardless of our record, we were successful. We gained a lot of playing experience at both the JV and Varsity levels. This experience will prove to be valuable in the years to come.

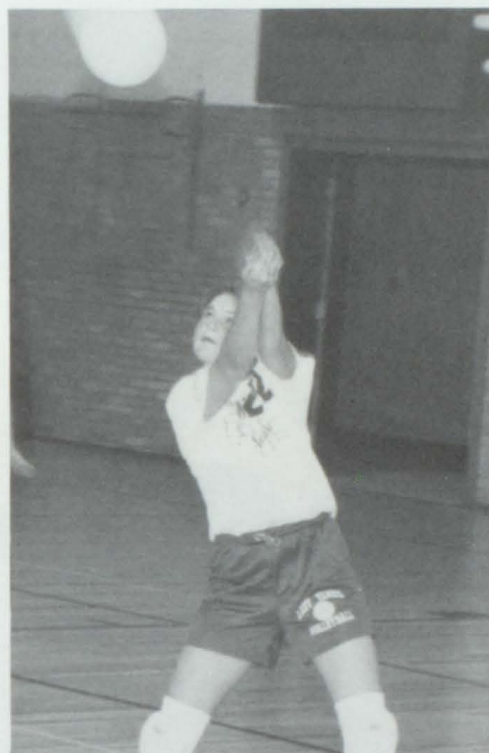

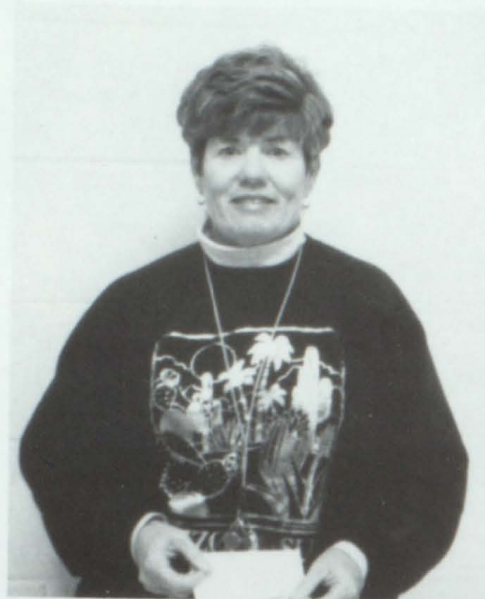

So many small things can make so many big things happen. However, the effort was there, and we made the games exciting to watch. We should be proud of that.



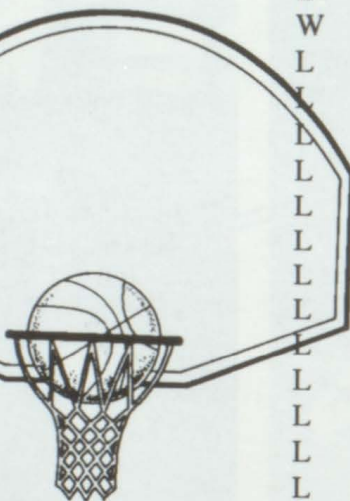

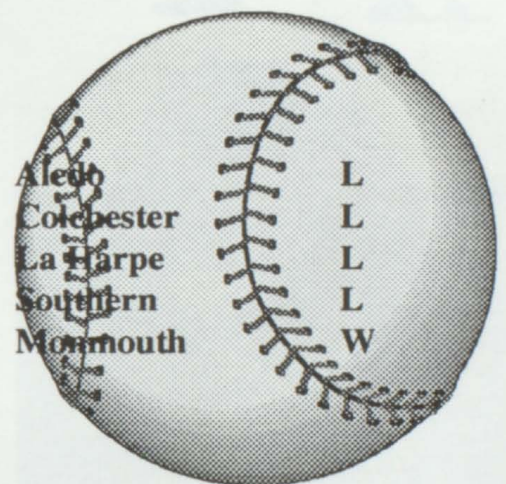

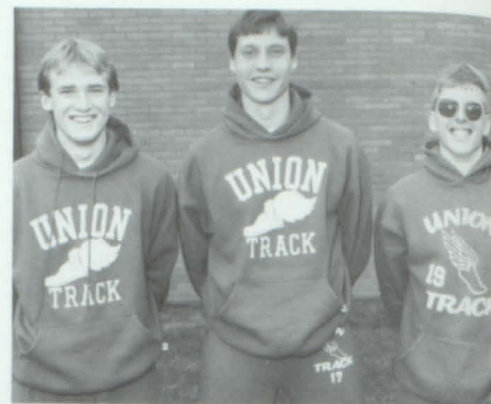

On February 7th Rory Parilac placed first in English and Michelle Olson placed third in Computers at state.

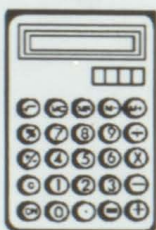

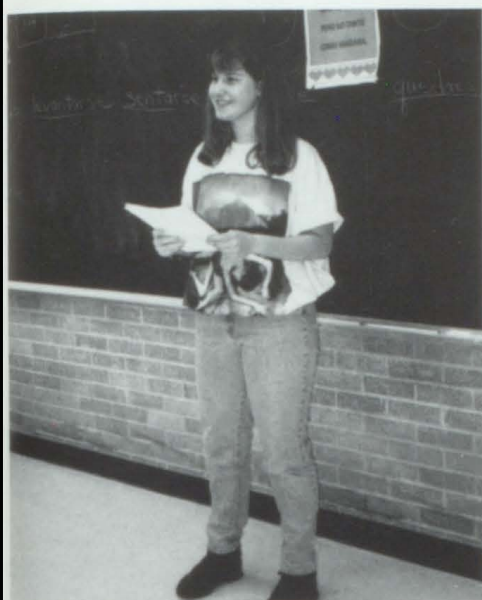
Speech

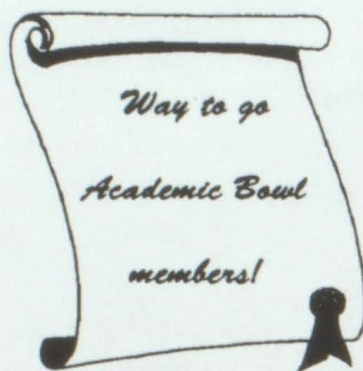
