picture reminds us of what we were like.



With our Juniors and Sophomores getting a lot of playing time, and a big group of Freshmen, we should expect good things happening for the 1995 football team.







With the large sophomore class, the freshman had a difficult time breaking into the starting line-up. However, we were able to gain experience during four freshman games and scrimmages.






J.V. Volleyball








