


# "Nothing Lasts Forever"






The lone win of the season was by far the best game of the year. It came against Alwood and the team played great down the stretch.








# Let's Get Fired Up!




Although the team was not always winning, the girls played hard no matter what the situation. They had their share of great plays and mistakes, but overall the team was enthusiastic and determined.










With all the problems and tough times the team overcame


the odds and pulled out three wins. The biggest triumph came against a very good La Harpe team. This was revenge for earlier in the year when La Harpe beat the Yankees.


