In 2019, the varsity and JV locker rooms underwent significant renovations.

The traditional hallway lockers of previous years have been replaced with dedicated athletic lockers that accommodate all of an athlete's gear, along with their personal belongings. A new basketball board, which allows coaches to make pregame and halftime adjustments, was also installed. In addition, Coaches Hess and Williams, along with several student volunteers installed new lights and repainted both rooms.

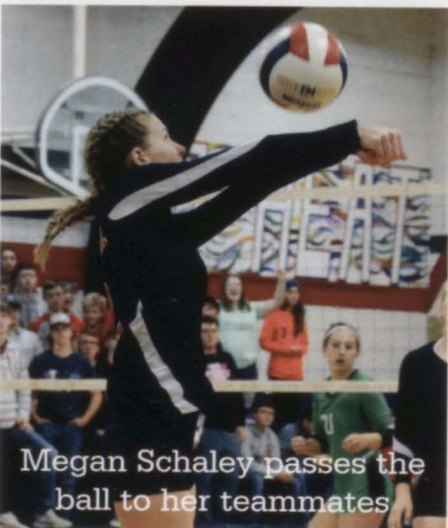

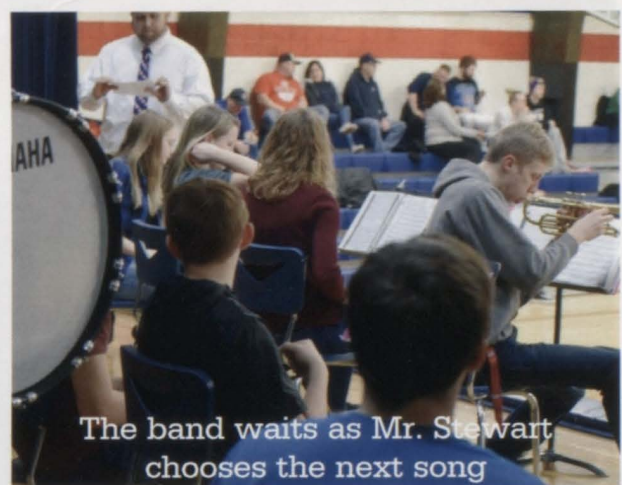

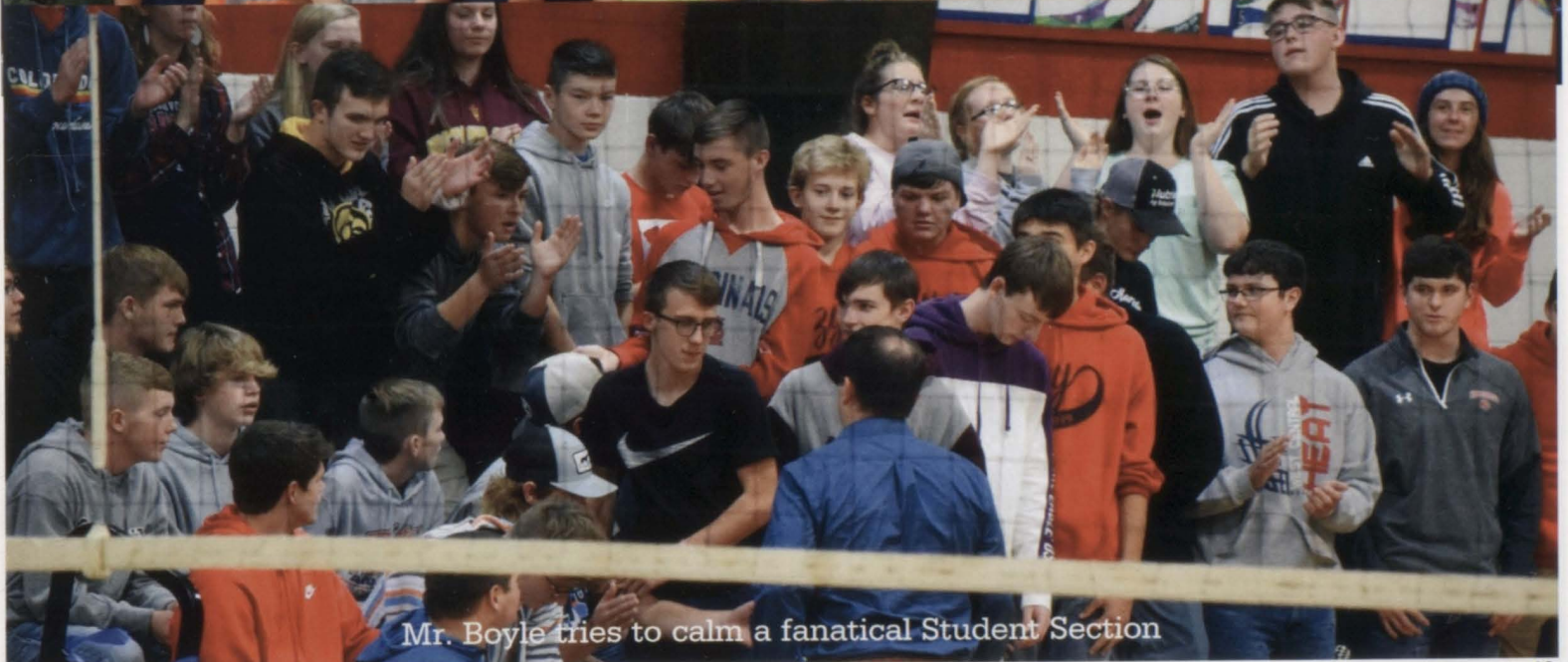

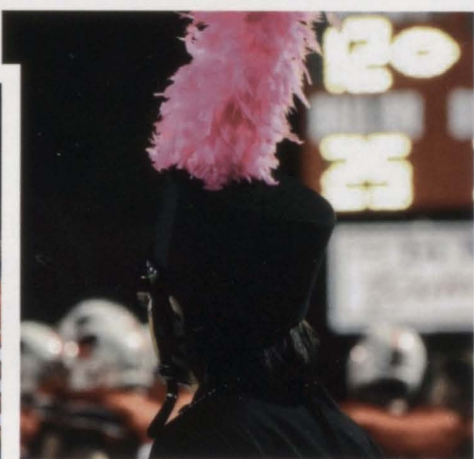


Cross-Country

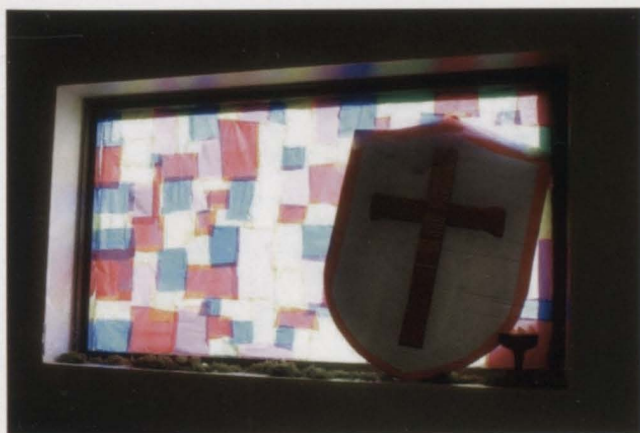

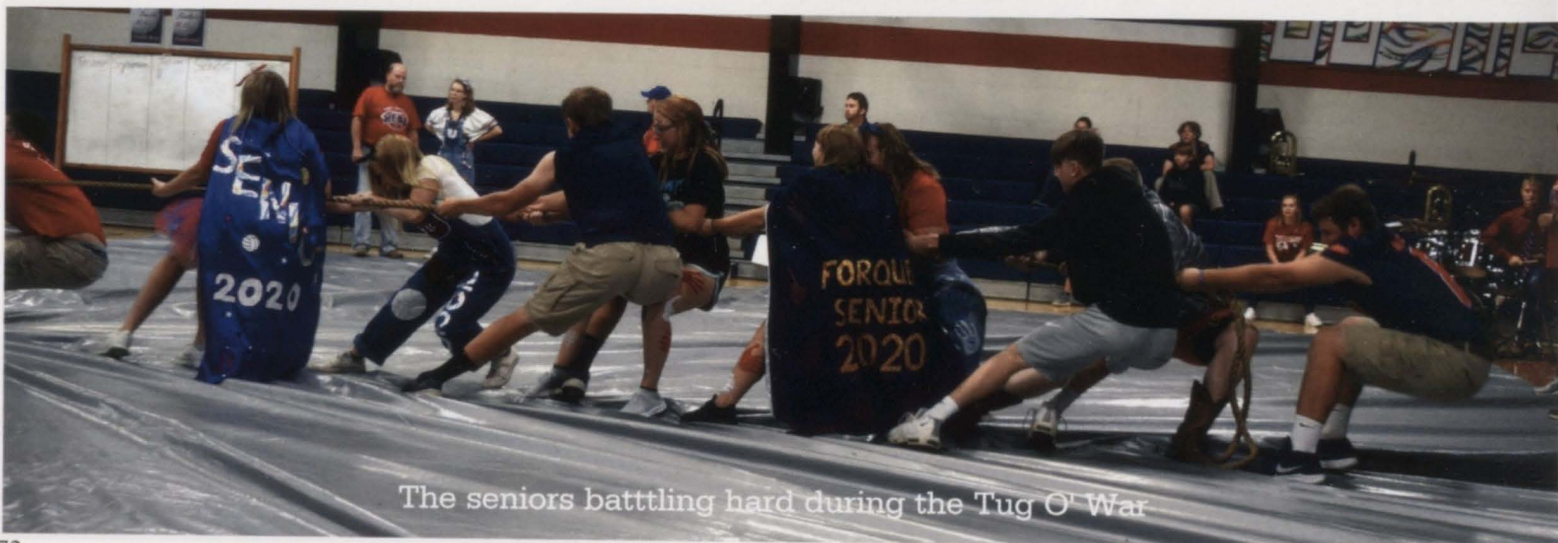

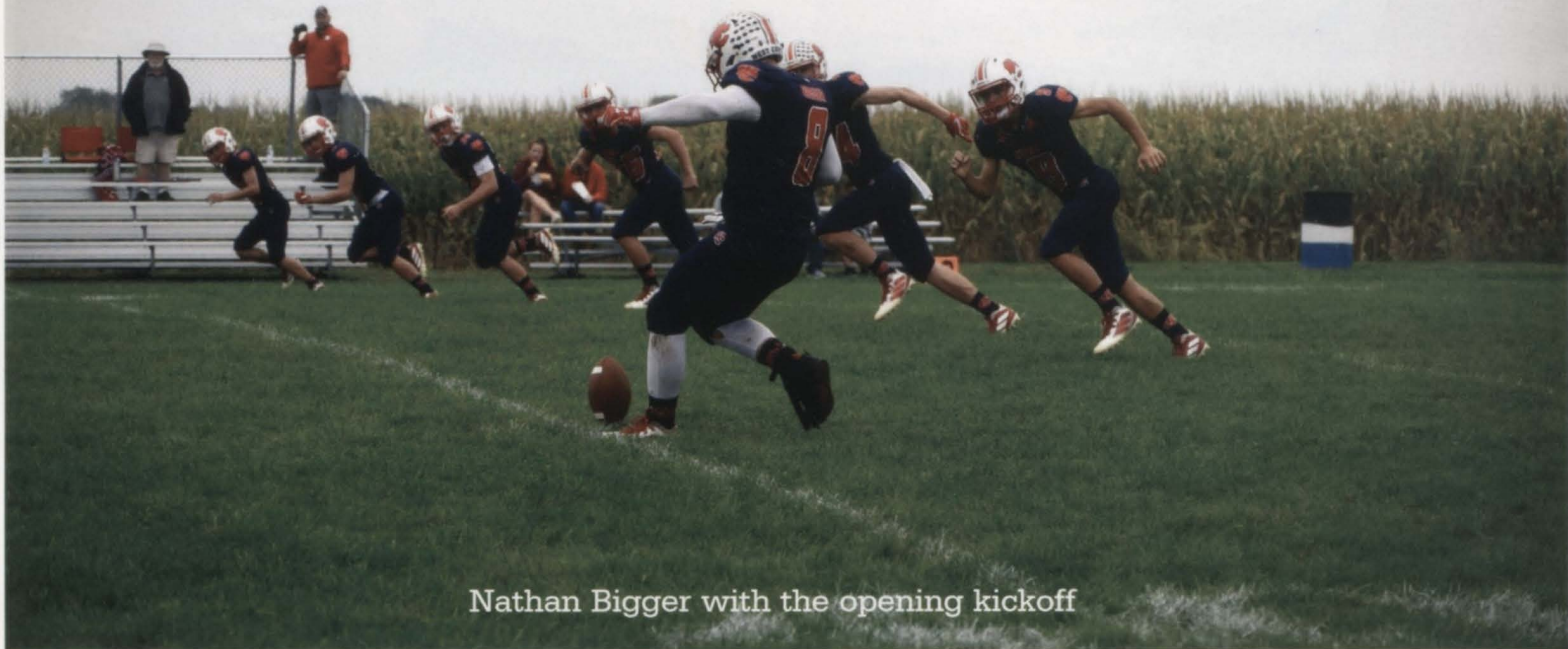
