New to W.C. Campus Improvments



This school year Mrs. Ouellette was given the opputunity to test a new style of classroom. This new approach to a learning environment features chairs that are on wheels, to facilitate communication in the class. Also, all of the tables in the class were whiteboards, which allowed students to communiciate ideas to one another easier. The last major change was the inclusion of new technology, which allowed access to new learning resources. I n 2019, the varsity and JV locker rooms underwent significant rennovations. The traditional hallway lockers of previous years have been replaced with dedicated athletic lockers that accomodate all of an athlete's gear, along with their personal belongings. A new basketball board, which allows coaches to make pregame and halftime adjustments, was also installed. In addition, Coaches Hess and Williams, along with several student volunteers installed new lights and repainted both rooms.


